The introduction should be clear and provide the issue to be discussed in the manuscript. Before the objective, authors should provide an adequate background, and very short literature survey in order to record the existing solutions/method, to show which is the best of previous researches, to show the main limitation of the previous researches, to show what do you hope to achieve (to solve the limitation), and to show the scientific merit or novelties of the paper.<sup>1</sup> At the end of the paragraph, the author/s should end with a comment on the significance concerning identification of the issue and objective of the research.<sup>2</sup>

**METHOD** ← *for Original Research Articles*

This method is written in descriptive and should provide a statement regarding the
