



1) ArcGIS Desktop to MS Excel and back



Exporting an attribute table from ArcGIS Desktop into MS Excel is easy:

- 1. Select whatever features you want in the attribute table.
- 2. If needed: open the attribute table.
- 3. Table Options...Export...
- 4. Select if you want to export the entire table (All records) or just the Selected Records.
- 5. Under Output table browse to wherever you want to save your new table. In this case use the \week8 folder.
- 6. Under Save as type: select Text File and click on Save.
- 7. Start MS Excel, select All Files, open the text file (*.csv) you just created, and save as MS Excel workbook.
