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Alida's List: A list of commitments that professional drama therapy organizations can make

- Request that your Professional Dramatherapy Organization (hereafter PDO) declare a Climate Emergency.
- Ensure that your PDO establish a 'Sustainability and Towards Net Zero' working-party and develop its goals and remit.
- o Draft, discuss, finalize and adopt the Sustainability/Towards net zero targets for your PDO members.
- o Develop and publish a 'sustainability and net zero pledge' that PDO members are asked to sign and keep.
- o Produce and distribute the PDO Journal in a carbon-neutral way.
- o Ensure that CPD events and Conferences meet your PDO's Sustainability/Towards Net Zero goals.
- Generate and provide PDO members with guidance regarding the acquisition and use of sustainable materials in their practice and optimum ways to reuse or recycle these.
- Ensure that PDO members/trainees avoid 'single use' plastics in their practice, including balloons, single-use plates, cutlery and cups.
- Promote the participation of PDO members/trainees in sustainability groups in Healthcare, Education and other work settings.
- Encourage PDO members to request a sustainability policy as well as a carbon calculation for any conference, CPD or other training events they attend or offer.
- Generate carbon calculations for the PDO office and the offices of other paid for services, and ask to see their Towards Net Zero plans.
- Request/require that training institutions teach dramatherapy students and supervisors about sustainable and net zero dramatherapy practice.
- Liaise closely with other creative arts-therapies and artist-associations as well as mental health professionals regarding their sustainable/net zero practice plans.
