Manuscripts that do not adhere to the guidelines outlined below may be returned for revision prior to review.

Paper Format: APA Style (7th edition), generically speaking. Main exceptions:

- The title page should not be a separate page. Instead, the title, author name(s), and affiliation(s) will appear at the top of the first page of the manuscript, followed immediately by the body of the text. However, *personally identifying information should be redacted or removed in the submitted version of the paper.*
- We do not enforce strict formatting rules for section headings. However, submissions should generally include the following sections in the following order, clearly labeled:
 - Introduction — This should be the first section of the main text.
 - Method, Methods, Methodology, or Procedure — Authors may choose their preferred label from the following, or something similar.
 - Discussion or Analysis — This section should interpret and contextualize your findings.

Authors are welcome to use additional section headings (e.g., Background, Results, Limitations, Conclusion) as appropriate to the structure of their paper, and we understand that some exceptional papers may incorporate a more creative or otherwise different structure.

Citation Style: APA Style (7th edition)

Citation Format: Author-date system for in-text citations and a reference list with DOIs

Font: Lora

Line Spacing: 1.15

Line numbers: All manuscript submissions must include line numbers in the left margin (continuous throughout the document) to aid reviewers and editors in providing specific feedback.

Length: Between 3,000 - 10,000 words (flexible)

Image resolution: After appropriately resized to fit within the body of the paper, all images must have a minimum resolution of 300 dpi for color or grayscale, and 600 dpi for black-and-white line art or combination figures (i.e., line art combined with grayscale or color elements).

Equations: All equations must be written using the built-in math tools in Microsoft Word, Google Docs, or similar software. Do not insert equations as images or screenshots. Authors who use LaTeX may easily toggle between LaTeX input and the native equation editor in these programs.

Abstract: You will be required to submit an abstract with all paper submissions, even initially. The abstract should be at most 300 words (inclusive).

Appendices: If you have carried out experiments or used code that generated data, and that data has been used in your paper, please provide ALL such codes and experimental data as a separate document, labeled "Appendix." This section should be at the very end of the paper.

Alternatively, you can upload all code and datasets to a publicly available repository and source them in your paper, either directly in your bibliography or linked under a “Code and Data Availability Statement.”

Authorial identification: Do not put any identifying information, including your name, in your *submitted* paper. Manuscripts must be anonymous to reviewers in order to preserve the integrity of the blind peer review process. If your paper is accepted for publication, we will update the manuscript to include your personal and biographical details in the published version.

About you: If your paper is accepted, please be aware that you will be required to submit a biography between 50 and 300 words (inclusive).
