

Project WILD's November 2020 WILD Learning Lab Sessions!

The Association of Fish & Wildlife Agencies (AFWA) invites you to join us for these weekly, one-hour learning opportunities to try out Project WILD activities that have been redeveloped for online synchronous learning and instruction. **Audience:** These free one-hour sessions are designed for . . .

- Formal and nonformal educators who have participated in Project WILD professional development workshops,
- Project WILD Facilitators, and
- Project WILD State Coordinators.

Schedule & Registration: (Please note that all times listed are in Eastern Time)

- <u>Thursday, November 5, 3:00 PM Eastern</u>—Oh Deer Online (v. 2.0) Simulate fluctuations in a population of white-tailed deer with a Yahtzee-style five dice game. This version 2.0 includes recent modifications to the procedures and scoring sheet for improved manageability. <u>Click here to register</u>.
- Thursday, November 5, 4:00 PM Eastern—Bat Blitz. This is the rescheduled session originally to be held on 10.29.2020, as well as a repeat of the "Bat Blitz" session on October 22. Through an online quiz, simulate bat survival to learn about roles bats play in ecosystems, threats to bats, and actions we can take to help bats. Click here to register.
- Thursday, November 19, 4:00 PM Eastern—Migration Headache. In this online version of
 this popular Aquatic WILD activity, students portray migrating waterbirds in order to
 describe the effects of habitat loss and degradation and make inferences about the
 importance of suitable habitat for migrating waterbirds. Click here to register.

To participate:

- 1. Register in advance. You will need to download Zoom software and set up a free Zoom account if you do not already have one. Visit https://zoom.us/support/download;
- 2. Prior to the session, review the online resources provided (see links below)
- 3. When logging in to the session(s), join with a computer. You will need to use a computer screen for viewing multiple windows simultaneously. A phone connection alone will not be sufficient.

<u>Space will be limited</u> in these sessions, and registration approvals will be on a first come, first served basis. For each session in which registration exceeds capacity, we will offer one or more additional sessions for that activity on future dates. After you submit the registration information, you will receive an email notifying you if your registration was approved or denied. If approved, the message will include a pass code that will allow you to join the session.

Links to the recordings and the supporting documents for the sessions will be available on the <u>AFWA YouTube</u> site approximately one week after the event. You do <u>not</u> have to participate to access the recordings.
