# What You Need to Know

The purpose of readiness courses is for students who would benefit from extra time in the classroom. Students who could use all around academic support and help in learning classroom routines and behaviors would be best served in a readiness class. Students will be recommended by their teachers, but they can also be registered by their parents.

**The purpose of enrichment courses** is for students to have fun and learn. All enrichment classes will include academic enrichment, but students will have fun learning about everything from hiking and recycling to Dungeons and Dragons!

#### **Interventions**

Students who need interventions for reading or math this year will still be receiving the support. We will be asking classroom teachers to recommend students for interventions so we can help the right students the most. We have teachers working with specific grade levels this year, and we have support staff to help make sure our children are getting exactly what they need all summer long!

We will be offering WIN from 12:00PM to 3:30PM at Herrman Elementary and Southside Early Learning Center for those students who are attending summer school in grades K-8. ### **Pre-registration Required**

Pre-registration is **required** this year in order to guarantee enrollment for students in Camp Sparta. A separate pre-registration is required for each student whom you plan to enroll.

#### **Summer School Locations**

STEMKAMP will be at Meadowview Middle School.

Students entering grades PreK and K will attend Southside Early Learning Center.

Grades 1st through 8th will be at Herrman Elementary.

Grades 9-12 (Credit Recovery) and all fitness classes unless otherwise noted will be held at Sparta High School in June.

Beginning on July 1, 2022 all classes held at Sparta High School in June will move to Meadowview Middle School WITH THE EXCEPTION OF SPARTAN FIT.

#### **Internet Access**

### **Attendance Policy**

Attendance is encouraged for all classes, but for credit recovery classes, it is **required**. For enrichment classes, students get the most out of the opportunity if they attend every day.

#### **High School Credit bearing courses**

Any credit bearing courses at the high school or middle school level that don't have a high enough enrollment to offer two sections will be consolidated into one section, HS Summer Session 1. Students who wish to take two different courses will be accommodated whenever possible.

The dates for high school credit-bearing courses this year will be HS Summer Session 1 June 13-June 29 7:30AM-1:30PM and HS Summer Session 2 July 11-27 7:30AM-1:30PM. Students are required to attend for the entire length of the class. Lunch will be provided.

#### **SVLA SUMMER!!!**

A limited number of courses will be offered this summer online to include the following: Health and Personal Wellness (this will satisfy the freshman requirement for Health), US Government, and Economics. Each of these courses will require a license fee of \$50.00 per student if the course is not completed with a passing grade. #### **CRMSC-Middle School Credit Recovery (Grades 7-9)**

This course is for students who did not show proficiency in one or more of their core classes at the middle school. They will come and work to improve their skills for the class(es) in which they need support. When they have shown proficiency, they no longer need to attend.

# **Grades 9-12 Credit-Bearing Courses**

All courses will be held in-person at Sparta High School UNLESS THE COURSE IS OFFERED BY SVLA.

\*\*\*STUDENTS OF IN-PERSON COURSES ARE PERMITTED TO MISS ONE COURSE PERIOD. WHEN THEY ARE ABSENT A SECOND TIME, THEY MAY BE WITHDRAWN FROM THE COURSE.\*\*\*

#### SSENGL-Credit Recovery English (Grades 10-12)

This course is for students who have not earned a credit in their school-year English classes. It is mostly an independent study class with time spent each day in large-group instruction and discussion. The focus is on improving personal English skills for life after high school.

### SSMATH-Credit Recovery Math (Grades 10-12)

This course is for students who have not earned a credit in their school-year math classes. It is mostly an independent study class with software designed to support students in learning the skills they missed in the class they need to repeat. The focus is on improving personal math skills for life after high school.

Offered: Session 1 June 13-June 29 7:30-1:30

Session 2 July 11-July 27 7:30-1:30

#### SSSCI-Credit Recovery Science (Grades 10-12)

This course is for students who have not earned credit in their school-year science classes. Students can make up one semester of Biology, Chemistry, or Physics. The focus is on improving personal skills that will improve scientific thinking.

Session 2 July 11-July 27 7:30-1:30 (pending enrollment)

#### SSECON-Economics (Grade 11-12)

Economics is a required course that focuses on how individuals and societies make choices about how to use scarce resources to fulfill unlimited needs and wants. This course examines both microand macro-economic themes. Topics include supply and demand, economic systems, labor and management issues, fiscal policy and government spending, monetary policy and the banking system, and measuring the economy.

Offered: Session 1 June 13-June 29 7:30-1:30

Session 2 July 11-July 27 7:30-1:30 (pending enrollment)

#### SOHUGEO-Human Geography (Grades 9-12)

This course provides hands-on activities where students learn how geography impacts society and how the interrelationships of different nations affect our world. Throughout the course, students will have the opportunity to develop a foundation for interpretation of geographical influences that affect the world today and tomorrow. These influences may include historical, cultural, environmental, political, and/or economical. The course develops basic skills used in all levels of the Social Studies Curriculum.

Session 2 July 11-July 27 7:30-1:30 (pending enrollment)

#### SSUSG-American Government (Grade 12)

This introductory course in political science deals with the federal government system, stressing the relationship of the national government to state and local governments. Subject matter includes the Constitutional basis, the structure of the three branches, political processes, policy making, civil rights and liberties, and some of the problems facing the nation in our contemporary world. Emphasis will be placed on obtaining basic competency of fundamental concepts and their application to daily life.

Offered: Session 2 July 11-July 27 7:30-1:30

# **SVLA Summer Offerings**

A limited number of courses will be offered this summer online to include the following: Health and Personal Wellness (this will satisfy the freshman requirement for Health), US Government, and Economics. Each of these courses will require a license fee of \$50.00 per student if the course is not completed with a passing grade. If students wish to drop an SVLA course, they must drop it before May 27 or pay the \$50.00 fee. Courses will be taught by a local teacher on the same platform (WEN) used during the school year. Students who sign up for a summer SVLA course AND their parents will be required to complete a contract before they will be allowed to begin the course. Students who have not previously participated in a class offered by WEN will also be required to complete our orientation course (Sparta Student Skills) before they will be able to begin their summer course. This orientation takes about 90 minutes to complete and teaches students how to navigate the platforms required for their course (Genius and BUZZ). The dates for summer SVLA are as follows:

#### May 27, 2022

- Online learning coordinator opens the orientation class for new online students or opens content classes for experienced online students
- Online learning coordinator opens classes

- Teachers will schedule their own office hours by class.

#### **SVECON-SVLA Economics (Grades 11-12)**

Economic decisions affect us every day of our lives. Understanding economics means thinking about how scarcity, or limited resources, requires us to make choices and evaluate one option against others. In this course, you will recognize examples of economics in your daily life. You will see how the economic choices of larger groups, like businesses and governments, affect you and others. As you progress through the course, you will recognize that the costs and benefits of choices connect individuals and groups around the world. The purpose of this course is to help you become a smart

consumer who understands the flow of an economy between individuals, businesses, governments, and the rest of the world.

#### **SVHEAL-SVLA Health and Personal Wellness (Grades 9-12)**

Health is a course that helps us to make wise decisions regarding our mind and body positively influences our attitudes and behavior involving critical areas of human development. We will explore body systems, disease prevention, human wellness and consumer health. This class will help you to appreciate your good health and will hopefully steer you toward optimal health

#### **SVUSGO-SVLA US Government (Grade 12)**

Responsible citizenship, including civil and political participation is essential to maintain a representative government that truly represents the people of the United States. In this course, students learn about the structure of government and how it shares power at the local, state and federal levels. This course also explores founding principles that inspired the Constitution and Bill of Rights, preserving the freedoms that students experience daily. Students will examine the processes of each branch of government, the election process, and how citizens can impact public policy. The media, interest groups and influential citizens provide examples of how the government can be affected by informed and active participants. Students will examine the U.S. Court system, and become a part of the process by participating in the judicial decision making process. They will also discover ways the United States interacts with countries around the world, through domestic policy, foreign policy and human rights policy. Completion of this course will allow you to act as an informed citizen who is ready to participate in the American democracy!
