Activity

- <u>Katy Trail</u>: Located in the heart of Dallas, former railroad line now beautiful 3.5 mile walking/running trail. It reminds me of NYC's West Side Highway. You always run into a friend or a dog that you know!
- <u>Perot Museum of Nature and Science</u>: Dallas establishment and fabulous for kids and families.
- American Airlines Center: Dallasites are passionate about... Dallas sports. Loyal fans from all over come to watch the Mavericks and Stars (usually) kick butt.

Booze

- <u>Inwood Tavern</u>: Jell-O shots anyone? Looking to get loose? Want to bust a move when the alcohol hits the system? This is your spot!
- <u>Time Out Tavern aka the TOT</u>: Divey as can be, pool tables and very cold beers. (Pro tip... after you've had a few beers, walk over to Inwood Tavern^)
