

Snap page guidelines

This page should be a showcase of your best Snap work AND what you learned about making webpages. I will leave the design up to you, but be sure to include the following on your Snap page.

Snap requirements

Each of these items must have an **explanation** for the non-coder about why you chose it or what you like about it, how you made it, etc. You must have AT LEAST one of each item.

- ★ iframe : embed a shared Snap link, probably your click Alonso / whackamole game, with explanation ([requirement #11](#))
- ★ image (paste screenshot into Paint to crop/save/upload): interesting or pretty design(s) you made, with explanation ([requirement #5](#))
- ★ image (save/upload a script pic"): interesting or advanced piece(s) of code you made, with explanation ([requirement #5](#))

additional HTML / CSS requirements

- ★ custom tab title (refer to [requirement #1](#))
- ★ div's to organize and beautify your site (background color, text size / font / color, alignment, border, ...) (refer to [requirement #2](#), [3](#), [4](#), [6](#), [7](#))
- ★ active (clickable) link(s) - at a minimum, you should have a link back to your index.html page (refer to [requirement #9](#))
- ★ optional: anything from the optional sections or things you learned on your own - google is a great way to research how to make your page look the way you want it to
