TFA Alternative Licensure Program Content Exam Applicant Guide

CONTENT EXAM REQUIREMENTS

In order to earn a Professional Educator License (PEL) in the state of Illinois, teacher candidates must take and pass all relevant content exams required for their licensure areas. These content exams are required for all teacher candidates in MAT programs in Early Childhood, Elementary, Middle Grades, Secondary, and Special Education seeking initial licensure and/ or subsequent teaching endorsements. Passage of content exams prior to the start of the Alternative Licensure Program and earning the ELS (APE) is a National Louis University requirement with guidance from the Illinois State Board of Education.

REGISTERING FOR THE CONTENT EXAM

Licensure exams are administered by the Illinois Licensure Testing System (ILTS), which is overseen by the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE).

Step 1: Identify the exam(s) you need to take.

All teacher candidates seeking licensure must pass the content exam(s) associated with their subject area. Please use the table below to determine which exam(s) to take.

Step 2: Open the hyperlink associated with the desired exam(s) and begin the registration process.

Teacher candidates are responsible for paying for the test fees at the time of registration.

Step 3: Locate ILTS study materials for the exam(s) to be taken.

Please note that there are both free sample questions and for-purchase study materials available for each Content Exam listed on the ILTS site. Choose your content exam from the list provided in the following chart:

Step 4: Report Exam Scores to NLU

During the registration process, please select National Louis University as the Educator Preparation Program to receive your exam scores. Upon the completion of your exam, you will receive a printout with either a pass or fail result. Your score report, with the final score and the subarea scores, will be emailed to you two weeks from your exam date. NLU will receive your scores at the same time.

Content Exam Testing Schedule

It can take multiple attempts to pass a content exam. ILTS requires candidates to wait 14 days between exams. The table below is the content exam testing schedule that can lead you to successfully pass your exam. Once you earn a 240 on your exam, you have passed, and you do not need to retake it. You may pass on the first try, or it might take several. Please don't feel discouraged; we are here to support your success. Please plan on taking the exam according to the dates listed in the table.

Please note that Alternative Pathway Candidates must pass the content exam by June 30, 2025, to begin the Alternative Licensure Program in the summer of 2025.
