7	respect and tolerance, self belief	<p>Students will develop their sense of self and self-belief through actively engaging in group work and positively contributing within teams. Students will be given the opportunity to experience leadership roles within their PE sessions, allowing a greater understanding of tolerance and developing their confidence and communication skills. Students will be able to access the extensive leadership programme from Year 7 to develop personal skills. Students will have the opportunity to compete in inter-house competitions as well as local and National competitions through the extra@ programme. Students start to understand the values of winning and losing and how to cope with both. Students are taught to respect one another and listen to ideas when deciding how to form a strategy and tactic.</p>
8	participation and resilience	<p>Students will develop their resilience and realise how it is extremely instrumental in changing outcomes within their own and others performances; this enables students to respect one another and value individuals. Resilience is developed both within teams and at an individual level through fitness testing and assessment. Students will be able to participate in both competitive and non-competitive games during PE lessons and again will have the opportunity to compete at inter-house, local and national level competitions. Our leadership programme recognises achievement and participation, and rewards students as they progress their leadership skills. Students are expected to apply tactical and strategic decisions that they make before and during games, activities and competition, all of which encourages more communication, leadership and self-belief.</p>
9	independence and evaluation	<p>Building upon the experiences of Year 7 and 8, students will develop greater independence by increasingly exploring performances in small groups, teams and individual work. Students are further encouraged to pursue leadership roles and gain more ownership within PE lessons, helping our students to become more independent. Leadership allows the evaluation of the students' own and others' performance; this leads to a more tactical and strategic performance within PE lessons and when competing against other schools. Students are encouraged to look at their own performances through analysing their own components of fitness and identifying where their strengths and weaknesses lie. Our KS3 assessment also helps shape this evaluation.</p> <p>By the end of KS3, every student will have been given the opportunity to go surfing and be taught water safety; this allows more independence within the community and the safe use of the local beaches.</p>

10	Building social confidence	<p>Yr10 students will continue to participate in local/regional/ national competitive frameworks, adding fulfilment to their lives through extending their opportunities. Students will have specialised within their chosen sports and will be given opportunities to develop themselves and their performances through the use of our excellent sporting facilities like the fitness suite and our extensive school club links. Our Year 10 PE curriculum allows for flexibility so that our students get to choose their activities for each term based around the national curriculum framework. For those students who follow a less competitive pathway, they are given the opportunity to gain interests in alternative activities to encourage a healthy lifestyle for when they leave education.
