GUIDING QUESTIONS

1. What does philosopher Shannon Sullivan mean by “good white people?”
 2. People in the American North often believe that the Civil War was a moral crusade in which the Union intervened to end slavery and “save” black people from bondage. Is this an accurate summary of what happened?
 3. What is the meaning of aversive racism? Often people think of racism as a problem of bigoted individuals or organizations like the KKK. What are some of the ways that racism takes on more-subtle but perhaps more-pervasive forms?
