Preparation prior to the presentation

- Review the script to make sure it feels right for you (feel free to add tips or things you saw in the classroom when using KBI!).
- If doing the team challenge, create a class and class code for the activity and post the class code on slide 32 of the presentation
- Teachers need online access, so either devices must be available, or they need to bring their own, such as a cell phone or notebook.
- Days or weeks before training, inform <u>training@kidsboostimmunity.com</u> of the date/time/school district/province so KBI's team can approve teachers immediately so they can access lessons and make a class/team. Otherwise, the resources to do that are below.

Slide 1

Hello! I asked for a little time today to share a resource I have really enjoyed using in my classroom—Kids Boost Immunity (KBI). Since we are all here, I thought it would be an opportunity to share the site and what I love about it and to have a quick activity so you can explore it, too.

Just a quick note—don't worry about copying anything down. Later, I will share links to the two important resources: the program website and the Quick Start Guide, which provides access to free lessons and resources. The guide explains how to create a class and provides student instructions.

Slide 4

Whip around the room...share your name, school, and grade(s) you teach.

Slide 5

Content is developed mostly by teachers, along with health professionals where needed, and support to fund, administer, and partner is with the organizations listed.

Slide 6

Okay, so let's look at these 3 statements. Which are you feeling the most today? Who are my 1s? You want something new, something fresh, and something the students will actually enjoy. Who are my 2s? You need things that you can use tomorrow and that are accessible and memorable. And my 3s, who are already feeling the crunch of trying to fit in all the needed content. New resources need to be relevant and of the best quality, right? We all are a mix of these 3, really- we want engaging, easy-to-use, quality classroom resources.

Slide 7

This is why I love KBI. It's so simple but powerful. Complete lessons on the site which connect directly to what we are learning in the classroom. Use as many teacher resources as you want. Have students complete the quizzes at the end of the lessons, and they will earn vaccines for children around the world through KBI's partnership with UNICEF. That is it. Learn important content. Help change the world.

Slide 8

This is why KBI is my first choice for resources—it's free, it is Canadian content and is connected with each province's curricula, and it uses experts in the medical and educational fields to ensure its resources support learning.

Here are some of the social studies lesson topics.

Slide 12

Some lessons become available at relevant times of the year, such as these. So, there are more topics with lessons and resources that you can use when you need them.

Slide 13

Lessons have a link to Curriculum Connections that list outcomes by province/grade/subject.

Slide 14

Let's quickly look at the site. Feel free to take out your devices and look with me. It's www.kidsboostimmunity.com

Slide 15

Just popping it on the screen in case you need the address

Slide 16

Here is what the home page looks like. (NOTE for presenter: On the homepage, there is a short introductory video. I suggest you play the video for longer training sessions, i.e., 25 minutes or longer.) You will also see this page, which has resources available in English and French. Top right-click SIGN UP to create a free teacher account to access lessons and resources.

Slide 17

From there, you will be taken to this page. Make sure you sign up as a teacher so you can create classes! Use your school email to be approved right away. If you would like the French option, you can choose it now. Once you are all signed up, the FREE lessons and accompanying resources are available to you. It takes less than a minute and is completely free.

Slide 18

(NOTE to presenter: You need to inform training@kidsboostimmunity.com of the date/time/school district/province days or weeks ahead if you want teachers approved immediately so they have access to lessons. It will take a few minutes. Otherwise, show teachers the rest of the presentation and give resource links.) It may take a few minutes to be approved.

Slide 19

Now that you have an account, click on the large Lessons button to see all the learning modules that are available.

Slide 20

Select your grade. This is also really helpful if you want some adapted materials because older or younger grades will have simpler or more advanced lessons and excellent resources for extra support or enrichment.

Slide 20

Use the learning module filter option to select Social Studies.

Slide 22

Now, you can see all the learning modules available for your grade for Social Studies. Here they are. *NOTE:* suggested as the end of intro presentation (approx 15 minutes)

Slide 23

Here is an example of how lessons look. This is for the Grade 9 Indigenous History in Canada learning module Life on Turtle Island. You can see there are seven lessons.

Slide 24

Also available with any lesson are Unit or Lesson Plans, just click on it to reveal the link.

Slide 25

Once you click on the link, a printable document is provided. You can also open it in a Google document to adapt as needed.

Slide 26

Let's return to the learning modules with a Social Studies filter and pick one to explore a bit more. Let's click on Environment and Climate Change. NOTE: *The position of the learning module will probably be different than shown here; look for this title.*

Slide 27

Now, I can scroll through all the lessons the students can complete on this topic. There are 6 lessons.

Slide 28

Here, I am going to Lesson 02, called Climate Change & Ecosystems, for grades 10-12. A younger grade version is available as well, just change your grade level. Lessons can include images, videos, and interactive educational games.

Slide 29

This is a continuation of the lesson. At the end of every lesson is a guiz.

Slide 30

The lesson quizzes look like this. Students must score 80% or more to pass this quiz and earn a lifesaving vaccine through UNICEF.

COMING SOON! A teacher quiz option to earn vaccines on behalf of students. This improves accessibility, as teachers will have the option of whether or not to have students use online devices.

Slide 31

Learning modules have accompanying Unit Plans. Here is the online version for Environment & Climate Change 10-12. This can be opened in Google Docs for teachers to adapt. You can see the types of resources teachers have instant access to. All the posted resources were created

by expert teachers and, if needed, nurses to ensure excellent quality and accuracy. Let's take a quick look at what they look like.

Slide 32

All links to lessons, lesson or video worksheets, and inquiry activities are provided. Teachers access answer guides by scrolling to the bottom of the page on KBI. For younger grades, there are literacy-building vocabulary worksheets and answers. These are helpful as ELL support.

Slide 33

These examples give a bit of an idea of some of the types of resources provided.

Slide 34

Check out new resources on Indigenous Teachings in The Teacher Centre.

Slide 35

Topics include Animal Helpers, Gender Roles, Grandfather Teachings, Strawberry Teachings, Tipi Teachings & Tipi Teachings Activity, and Turtle Island.

NOTE - Suggested end of a 30-minute presentation, but adapt in whatever way works best

Slide 36

Let's spend 5-10 minutes on a team challenge!

Slide 37

Read over these instructions! Get into a group of 2 to 4 people! Bring your devices with you or share as needed. When you have your group, send one person for the activity instruction sheet. Remember, you must complete this as a team! If any member moves on to the next question, your team will have an added challenge!

Slide 38

Here is the classroom code you will need to earn your vaccines with (NOTE - the teacher who is presenting will need to create a class/team and use that class code).

Slide 39

Remember to complete each step together as a team!

Slide 40
