



Citizen Diplomacy Action Fund Finding Alumni Team Members

All Citizen Diplomacy Action Fund projects must have two Exchange Alumni team leads who are alumni of U.S. Government sponsored exchange programs. Additional Exchange Alumni team members are also allowed. The 1st team lead must be a U.S. Citizen Exchange Alumni. However, the second team lead can be either a U.S. Citizen OR International Exchange Alumni.

If you are searching for a co-team lead or additional team members, we have some options to help in your search:

1. Reach out to your exchange program implementer to see if they have resources for program alumni to connect. Do you have a program specific alumni group on social media? (Facebook, LinkedIn, etc.?) These are great avenues to use to reach out to other alumni.
2. Utilize your program's alumni association, if applicable. (For example, if you are a Fulbright alum, utilize the Fulbright Alumni Association).
3. Check out your program's specific website, sometimes they have an alumni resources tab that can help.
