The Voice of Idaho Amateur Radio Club Inc. maintains and operates high-quality, wide-coverage repeaters for the use of all amateur radio operators. The Voice of Idaho Radio Club operates and maintains Six analog repeaters, one fusion (YSF), three D-Star repeaters, and Three APRS digi-peaters. All the analog repeaters use 100 Hz PL tone.

\* The 146.840 (-) and the 444.900 (+) analog repeaters are located on 7,580-foot Shafer Butte Northeast of Boise.

- \* The 147.240(+) analog repeater and APRS located on War Eagle Mountain Southwest of Boise.
  - \* The 145.500 (-) and 444.350 (+) MHz are D-Star Digital repeaters located on 7,580 Shafer Butte Northeast of Boise.
  - \* The 146.620 (-) MHz analog repeater is located on 8,322-foot Snowbank Mountain, west of Cascade.
  - \* The 145.29 (-) MHz analog repeater is located in the Treasure Valley near the Boise airport, at an elevation of about 2800 feet.
  - \* Another D-Star repeater on 444.800 (+) is located near Jerome, Idaho
  - \* The Fusion (YSF) 443.700(+) MHz and 146.700(-) MHz Repeaters on Squaw Butte at 5800 feet.
  - \* APRS digi-peaters on the national frequency of 144.390 MHz are located on Shafer Butte, Snowbank Mountain and War Eagle Mountain..
- All VOI Club repeaters are open and may be used by everyone, although your financial support is most welcome and appreciated. It is expected that all users of VOI repeaters will adhere to the FCC rules for Amateur Radio operation.

## Treasure Valley Radio Association

Treasure Valley Radio Association Repeaters

Treasure Valley Radio Association currently has four repeaters installed which provide coverage along the Snake River and Weiser River in the Payette, Idaho and Ontario, Oregon area.

They are:

Butte Hill site (near Ontario, OR) with a 147.100 repeater and 444.150 repeater

Sheep Creek site (near Weiser, ID) with a 145.390 repeater and 147.120 repeater

Butte Repeater Site

The Butte Repeater site (shown above) is a low elevation repeater which is at 2700 feet elevation. It is located to the West of Ontario, Oregon and operates on the frequency of 147.100 MHz and 444.150 MHz. These repeaters have great coverage along US Hwy 95 in the Snake River valley between Weiser, Idaho to the North and Homedale, Idaho to the South. It provides great communications to local amateurs within this 50-mile range.

The Sheep Creek Repeater site is located north of Weiser on a ridge overlooking Manns Creek and its operating frequency is 147.120 MHz and 145.390 MHz. It extends coverage along US Hwy 95 North of Weiser, Idaho for another fifty miles. The elevation is about 2800 feet but has some dead areas in its coverage along the Weiser River.

These repeaters require a 100 Hz PL tone for access. The repeaters are Yaesu DR-1X repeaters and are auto set for both FM and C4FM modes. Please feel free to use them when in the area.
