How To Backup Your D4DJ Account

Backing up your D4DJ account is simple, fast, and **very important**. You may accidentally delete the app, or your device has an unfortunate meltdown. Backing up your account means you don't need to go through the lengthy process of trying to get your account recovered, or in the worst case, starting over.

This document explains the steps to do so in the Global version of the game, but the Japanese version is exactly the same.

This guide has been updated with the new Account Code changes that went into v4.2.10 in EN and v4.2.0 in JP. The important changes that came in are that **account** codes are no longer one time use and you no longer lose paid diamonds when transferring between different OS's. See the bottom of this document for a full explanation of the differences.

Creating an Account Code

The first and easiest way to create a backup is by creating an Account Code. An account code consists of a randomly generated string of characters and a password, which is decided by you.

Important! Account Codes are only shown to you once


a. When you create a transfer code, the game will display a screen for you containing the code and the password. It's recommended to write this down or screenshot it (or both) because after the screen goes away, you cannot access it again unless you create a new one. You can also upload the screenshot to external places such as a private discord server.

Steps to create an Account Code


1. While already logged in to the game, open the Settings menu from the top right. From this menu, choose Account code (アカウントコード).




2. In the Account Linkage screen, you will see 2 tabs, "Linkage via SNS Account" (SNS連携) and "Input Linkage Code" (アカウントコード発行). Tap on the Input Linkage Code tab (The SNS section will be covered later)



3. From the Input Linkage Code tab, you're asked to enter in a Password between 8 and 16 characters. Hit the OK button after you enter in the password




4. After hitting OK, the game will display your Account Code and the same password you just entered. You **MUST** either screenshot this screen, or write down the account code and password (or both). As soon as you press the OK button again, this screen will go away and you cannot see it again.



5. Once the OK button is pressed, the screen will change to look like this. If you forgot to screenshot it, or if you lost the screenshot, you can tap the Reissue button to reset it. It will then return to Step 3 and you can enter a new Password

again. If you need to recreate it, make sure you properly screenshot it/write it down, and make sure you discard old Account Codes so you don't get confused.




Using an Account Code

1. To use an account code (say you're linking your account to another device, or you've reinstalled the app), then you will need to enter the Account Code before you can login. From the title screen, tap on the Menu button from the bottom right of the screen. From there, tap on the Account Linkage button.

Note: The Account Deletion button will **permanently delete** whichever account is currently logged in **and also removes all account codes and links**. This action is not recoverable, so be careful!






2. Similar to when you created the Account Code, there will be 2 tabs here again. Once again, switch to the Input Linkage Code tab. Enter the Account Code and Password you have saved here, then hit OK. If the code and password are correct, it will display the account you will be transferring onto the device.

Please note! If there is an account already logged in on the device, it will be overwritten with the one you're transferring in. Make sure that you've created an account code for that account as well before finalizing the transfer.






3. After the transfer is complete, the game will restart, and you will now be logged in with the account you transferred with. Account codes can be used any number of times, so now you're good to go!

Linking to Apple ID or Twitter

Twitter linking is working on both servers, but went down for about a month. Do not rely on Twitter (or Apple ID) linking only and make sure to create an Account Code as well!

In addition to creating a transfer code, you can also link your account with Apple ID or with a Twitter account. Please note that you can only link a D4DJ with these 2 methods (aside from the account code). Apple Game Center and Google Play Store are **not** valid links and won't preserve your account in the case of an emergency. Some notes about linking with Apple ID or Twitter:

- Transferring with a link can be done unlimited times without needing to re-link
- Transferring is faster than with a code because it uses an external API to do the work.
- You still need to know the login credentials for your Apple or Twitter account (for Apple transfer, if you're logged into the device already you can use touch/face id to log in)
- You can only connect 1 account using either method at a time (You can't have 2 EN accounts linked to the same Twitter account You can, however, have an EN and JP account both linked to the same Twitter Account). Be careful about creating multiple Twitter accounts to house multiple D4DJ accounts, you'll still need to memorize (or write down) the Twitter passwords somewhere.
- Even if you link to Apple ID or Twitter, you can (and should!) still create an account code. Better safe than sorry!



Transfer Code and Account Code differences

Differences between Transfer Codes (old) and Account Codes (new)

- Transfer Codes were 1 time use only and needed to be re-created after every use. Account Codes can be used unlimited times
- In the past, transferring to a new device would remove your account from the old device. Now, when linking with an account code, your account will exist on both devices at once. However, you cannot play on both devices at the same time. When you are active on one of the devices, the account on the other device will be logged out.
- In the past, transferring to a different OS (Apple to Android or vice versa) would result in losing any paid diamonds you had. Now, the diamonds are stored and used per-OS. This means that, if you buy diamonds on an Apple device, you can only spend them while logged in to an Apple device. If you switch your account to an Android device, you will not lose the paid diamonds, but you cannot use them while logged in to the Android device.
