	We belong, participate and celebrate with our family whānau, school, our parish and Church. The Church is the followers of Jesus called by the Holy Spirit to carry on the work of Jesus today. When people belong to something they have privileges and responsibilities. The Church is a sign of God's love and presence in the world	The Scripture stories record how Jesus called the apostles to follow him. People who belong to the Church today through Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist are called to be like Jesus and to carry on his work by worshipping God, serving and loving God and others and acting with faith and tika. Through baptism people are called to serve others and to become holy. People do this through different vocations – as single people, married people, priests or religious men and women.	An important part of being a Christian includes worshipping God through prayer, proclaiming the Word of God and celebrating the Sacraments especially the Eucharist on the Lord's day. The Church is a pilgrim people on a life journey towards God. Since the Church began people have used their gifts to spread the good news of Jesus. People follow Jesus and spread his message using their gifts through their different ways of living as single and married people or as priests and people in religious communities.	Jesus was a teacher and that role is carried on by the apostles and the popes, the bishops, priests and teachers who have followed down through the ages until today. The Pope and bishops are the chief teachers of Jesus' message to the whole Church. The bishops in Aotearoa New Zealand share their work of passing on the teaching of Jesus with priests and lay people who teach in parishes and schools so everyone has opportunities to learn more about Jesus and the Church. 1. The Church is the people united with God

Overall	We want the children to know they ARE the church. The prayer - Christ has no body now but yours', hands etc... Becoming part of the church – Sacraments of Initiation – Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist That we are Disciples- following the way of Jesus Belonging and participating The Church shows us how we need to act in our lives - we are the Church how do people become part of the Church - Ceremonies, Initiations Church as the bride of Christ Church as the body of Christ We are a community of disciples , our parish is a sign of God in the world - Jesus founded the Church and that it is a sign which brings about God's presence and love in the world.
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Relational: Something about their personal connection with church. Maybe relating sacraments.

Extended Abstract: What about people who choose not to be united? What about if you come to school here but don't do sacraments? So are non-Baptised people part of the church? Church is not a building but a community in the world. United with God and not a building. What about other or no religion? Are they part of God's church? What about people who are for instance living a homosexual life?

2. We all have a responsibility in the Church

Overall	To take some responsibility like reading at church or altar serving or saying prayers What are we called to do because we are part of the church (vocations)? Roles in the church
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Relational: Through taking responsibility, you enrich yourself and grow. Participating. Team. Whanau/church responsibilities.

Extended Abstract: Aware that everything you do you work for God. Your life is a celebration of God. Giving praise to God - connected with heaven. We stand on holy ground. Lips/hands - connecting the Eucharist, or blessing, back into your life. Christ has no body now but mine.

3. There are formal responsibilities in the Church

Overall	<i>The work of the priest in the church – the priest carries out the Eucharistic sacrament Teaching role of bishops – only the bishops can interpret Church teaching guided by the Holy Spirit – the priests share this with the people but they do not interpret it. The Bishop is the shepherd of the diocese and has the shepherd's crook The role of the Pope All these can be found in the strand teaching books</i>
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Relational: Compare contrast, some people can do some roles, but not others. Compare sisters/brothers/priests/lay people and different orders.

Extended Abstract: Baptism is a gift and a responsibilities. WE are all priest, prophet and king. Been given but give back. Why aren't women priests? Why aren't priests married?

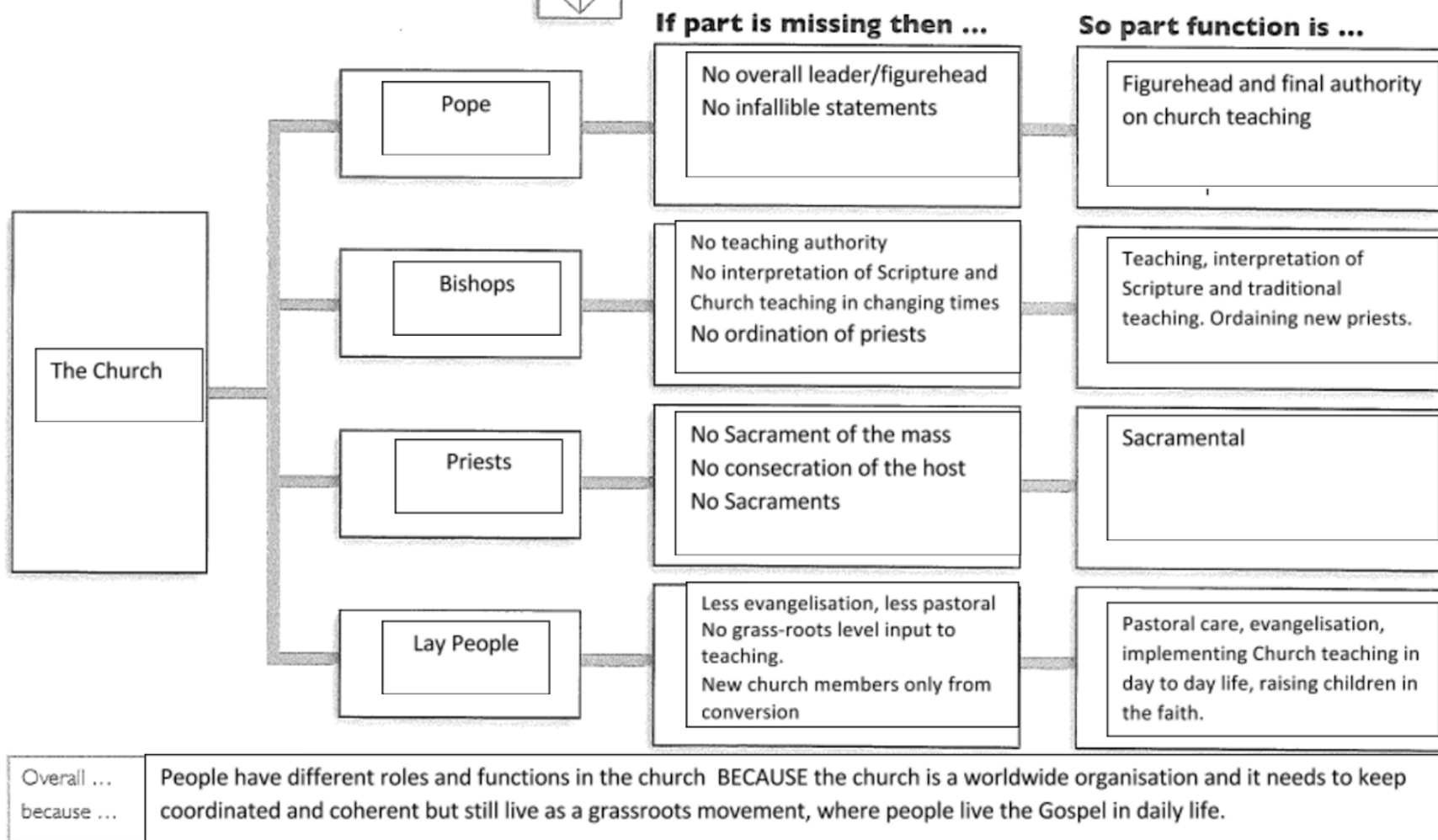
