The school provides the items in blue:

Tents will be provided by the school (If you want to use your own you will need to show us the week before you intend to use it)

Camping stoves and fuel will be provided by the school. We use the Trangia range with gas burners.

Cooking pans are included with Trangia stoves.

Scourers will be provided by the school as part of the Trangia stoves.

Trowel in a plastic bag (x1) - provided by school

First aid kit (x1) - provided by school which includes a tick remover

Maps (x2) and compasses (x2) will be provided by the school

General Advice

Waterproof Gear:

A waterproof coat is crucial; participants without the correct coat cannot join expeditions. The coat should have a waterproof rating above 10,000 mm, with 15,000 mm or higher recommended for longer trips (for reference Gore-Tex® is rated at 28,000 mm). Waterproof trousers are highly recommended but not mandatory.

Hiking Shoes:

Support, grip, and comfort are essential in hiking shoes. Waterproofing is a bonus but not required. Running shoes lack support for carrying heavy loads, and snow boots are too heavy. Lightweight hiking shoes are ideal for multi-day hikes.
