Membership

Membership Report - Tom Landon, chair



Currently we have a community of 42 members. We added 7 new members since our last Convention (welcome Wanda Callagy, Barb Hinkley, Harper Roth, Christine Selleck, Julie Smith, Lynda Tymeson, and Chantal Arcand-Doktor!). At the present time our total pledge amount including membership fees is at about \$7,536.00, and we have \$18,604 in our savings account!

Members form the core of our community and their pledges and fees sustain our ongoing structure and foundation for our spiritual work and community outreach. In addition, if we apply for a bank loan, for a piece of property or apply for a matching grant, they will look at ISD's pledge fulfillment rate as one measure of how reliable we will be in repaying the loan.

Some membership highlights from 2022-23:



- We began the practice of selecting a mentor for each new

member to help them get to know us better and understand our services and classes. This has been appreciated by our new members.

- A High Tea and Spirits event was held on June 5 at Tom's house, much to the delight of all attending. The gathering featured a reading of tea leaves, and messages given by several mediums in the group. Funds raised benefited The Hunger Coalition of Otsego County and Ajiri Tea's Foundation's Kenyan orphans.
- Our Christmas holiday gathering was held on December 18 at Tom's house and was a smashing success! Many people contributed delicious goodies of all types and a set of games certainly raised the spirit of the day.
- We continued the weekly get-together called "Mid-Day at the Oasis" Fridays at noon, up through October when the gazebo was taken down. We also met a few times inside after that date.
- The Instant Church Directory Online is ready for membership use. It is a very accessible (and password protected) way to find a fellow member's contact info. Membership is open to all who aspire to the path of Self Realization and wish to share their spiritual progress with the company of supportive and like-minded individuals.

How do I become a member?

Step one is a meeting with any of the Institute's Ministerial staff. The purpose of that meeting is to review the [Declaration of Principles](#) and discuss any questions you may have. Membership is annual. Cost of membership is \$25 for an individual, \$35 for a family. Every January, a membership renewal form is sent to current members, and the membership fee is paid once a year. Membership in the Institute is a little different than in many other organizations. People normally join after they have been attending for at least six months, and find it to be the right place for them. It feels like home, and people who choose membership are the ones who wish to ensure the future of the Institute. We don't actively seek members; members are drawn to us by their interests and commitments. We have many regular congregants who choose not to become members, and they are just as welcome as anybody else. It's a personal choice. There are two requirements of membership. One is that members pledge their financial support, generally on a monthly basis. The amount of the pledge is what feels right to the person pledging and is never discussed or made public. You may receive a statement mid-year summarizing your pledge status and letting you know where you stand, but you will never be approached regarding the fulfillment of your pledge. The second requirement of membership is that the members select an area of service, such as being on the hospitality committee, the publicity committee, the properties committee, or some other area of service to the Institute. We offer a small discount for classes and events at the Institute to members as thanks for their ongoing support.

When you become a member, we invite you to choose an area of service. Rev. Diana Friedell (Pastor), Kimberly Winsor (Board Chair), will help you determine where your assistance is best used.

This is borrowed from a Katherine Walters poem -read recently during a yoga class, and the author was talking about Joy:

The function of the Finance Committee is to track expenses and revenue, and to ensure that the financial reports given to the Board of Directors is accurate and within our financial means. Currently, Rev. Diana Friedell is the Finance Manager, and Sali Dellysse is the Treasurer who reports to the Board of Directors. Sali tracks all expenses and revenues and reports these to our CPA, Johna Peachin.

We continue to add to the savings account that we started in 2021 and currently we are able to save \$500.00 a month.

Peachin and Associates is still the accounting firm that we use and they provide a layer of accountability and accuracy as we build ourselves into the future. We pay them \$210.00 monthly to provide us with our monthly bank reconciliation and balance sheet reports as well as tracking our yearly memberships and pledges.

Also, we have a newly formed Grants Committee and we are actively seeking any ideas or inspirations for grant projects. This is an opportunity to get people active and aware of the possibilities.

Diana and Sali, with the help of our President, Kimberly Winsor worked tirelessly on creating a budget for 2022-2023 and presented it to the board in April at which time it was approved.

ISD ONEONTA ANNUAL Social Media REPORT- Amy Gallop

Social media has grown consistently and steadily during this past fiscal year. By visibly celebrating values of spirituality, inclusiveness, and healing, the ISD Oneonta online community has widened considerably.

Page Likes, Followers, and audience engagement continue to strengthen across both Facebook and Instagram. Facebook Events are the strongest part of our Facebook presence. Each event provides an overview of and a clickable link to ISD's class offerings. Posts are scheduled consistently and strategically to promote every Event. This effort works as free advertising for both the events and ISD Oneonta itself, as it allows ISD Oneonta to regularly show up on our audience's newsfeeds. In turn, our community frequently Likes and Shares these posts on their personal timelines. Taking full advantage of the variety of ways to share content, the ISD Oneonta Instagram page features regular posts, reels, Stories, and Story re-shares. All of these posts are automatically shared to Facebook, effectively doubling their reach. Our audience grows when we interact with other accounts, and so comments and shares of like-minded accounts are a regular part of the ISD Oneonta social media activity.

Overall, we have seen more growth on Facebook in the last year than we have on Instagram. This is undoubtedly in part because I have increased the number of scheduled posts for each Event. However, I also suspect that, as pandemic restrictions have loosened, folks are actively searching for community. Locals tend to use Facebook more than Instagram to find nearby activities and communities, so perhaps that also explains the difference in growth on Facebook compared to Instagram. Going forward, I will focus our Instagram account more locally to see if that impacts growth and engagement.

Based on the statistics of the past fiscal year, we can feel motivated that by continuing this work, the ISD Oneonta social media will continue to grow into 2024. See below for specific statistics on the social media growth, including visuals on the following page.

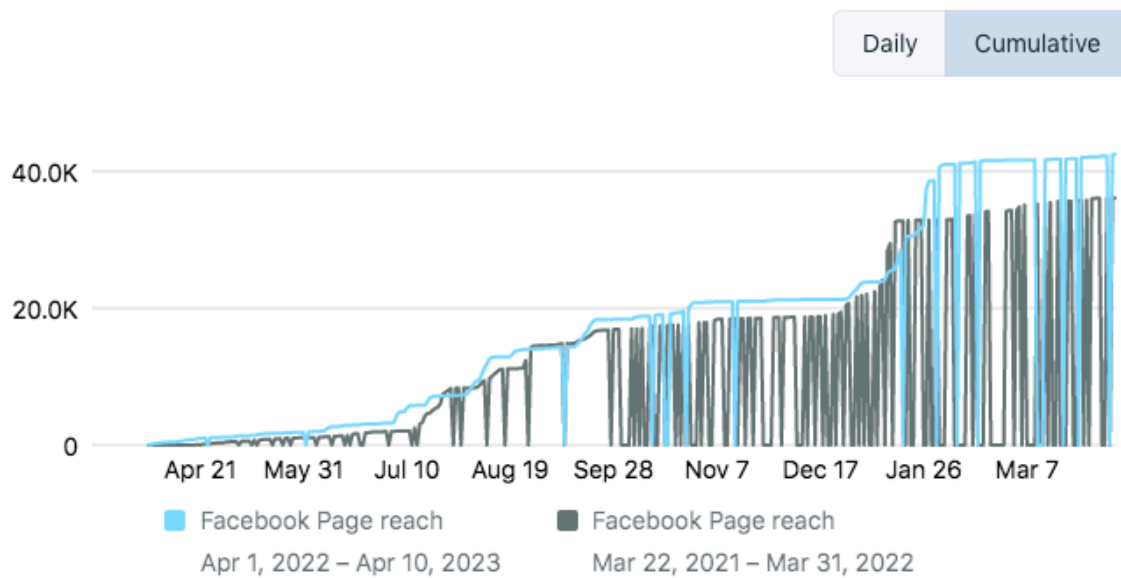

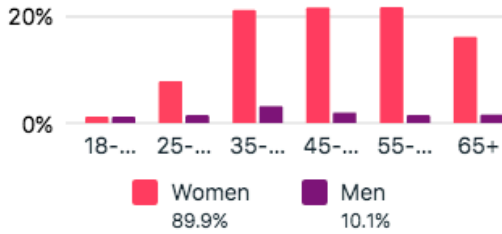

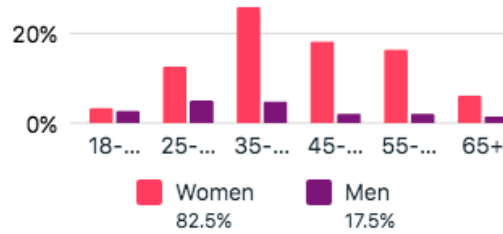

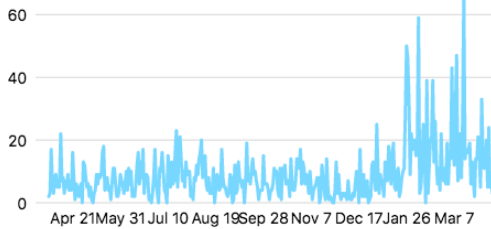

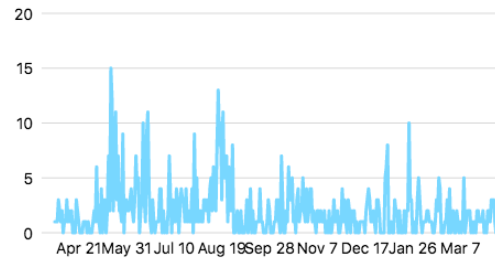

**Members Lending Library- Carol Callahan**

The ISD Lending Library has been open for business for two years, beginning in March of 2021. The library contains a wide array of books on various metaphysical topics including life after death, channeling, development of psychic ability, healing, dream analysis, Native American ceremonies and a wide selection of books by and about Edgar Cayce. A few DVDs are also available.
