Course Description:

Apologetics 2 equips believers to be able to engage with difficult questions and objections to the Christian faith and to be able to articulate a reason for the hope that a believer has. The class will include topics on intelligent design, the resurrection, the reliability of the Bible, competing worldviews, and apologetics in conversation.

Course Objectives:

Upon completion of this course, each student should be able to:

- **Identify** common objections and challenges to the Christian faith and explain the assumptions behind them.
- **Evaluate** evidence and arguments related to intelligent design, the resurrection of Jesus, and the reliability of the Bible.
- **Analyze** major worldviews and compare their assumptions about truth, morality, humanity, and the existence of God with the Christian worldview.
- **Articulate** biblical and rational responses to common objections to Christianity with clarity and confidence.
- **Apply** apologetic principles in conversations with people who hold different beliefs or worldviews.
- **Demonstrate** how apologetics can be used not merely to win arguments, but to point people toward the truth of the gospel with humility, wisdom, and grace.
