We are spending nearly ten times our highest recorded quarterly budget, for "benefits" that are of little to no use to us.

This is a... I believe the phrase is a 'white elephant'. Looks great on paper, but is of little to no use and is very expensive.

[5:15 PM] Sertor Valentinus - W. Sayville: For clarity,

I doubt anyone here knows about the MicroWiki Foundation, but it was a confidential plan to turn MicroWiki into an NPO. I was involved in the planning, and thank god it didn't go through... It had several issues with it inherent from the beginning. This act purports majority of the same issues, which are but are not limited to—

a. an international organization (such as the CA) would require the NPO to be registered in each country it would apply to (i.e the website is registered in Canada). This makes us required to follow their laws on top of the American ones, making it more complex to comply with policies, and even moreover financial records.

b. "The club must not claim to provide goods or services to the general public." - we do exactly this. The CA is "committed to the development and improvement of member nations." We also include the abilities that a non-delegate/observer doesn't have, such as voting on applicants, acts, etc.

c. We are a micronational organization. Should we really be establishing ourselves in a macronation just to seem "legit"? It seems entirely redundant if the point is to be independent from these countries...

d. 501 c(7) requires someone to maintain financial and administrative records. While I'm sure someone would be willing, I am incredibly fearful and doubtful that they would do it properly. I'd margin that a strong majority of us in this org. are younger than 18 - the ones who are 18 have to live in the US or Canada, understand complex tax forms, and maintain an ongoing compliance with the departments.

e. Every NPO needs a board of directors. While the CA already has this, the issue with it is that all the directors on the board have to be 18 or older; this creates excessive bureaucracy and a way to have more infighting, basically disinheriting the position of Chair, Vice-Chair, Superior Judge, and the latter offices. I definitely do not want to be accountable to 18-year-olds who are running a NPO which is masked by an micronational org.

Making us an NPO just to serve the purpose of seeming professional and to be credible is entirely pointless-the benefits are heavily outweighed by the disbenefits, and I don't personally think it is the correct move to take within an organization. I have always maintained this position since the MicroWiki Foundation.

This is a bit of an interesting one. Any member of the general public can apply, but at current, only members would receive these services.

[5:17 PM] Sertor Valentinus - W. Sayville: It is very clear that contrary to what some have stated.. we do not benefit from this at all. If anything, we lose out.

We are throwing away money, to lose a great deal of control over what the alliance can do. Its utterly bonkers.

[5:17 PM] Larry Martin - Waterside Park: Considering members can't instantly join, they need to go through a whole system and get voted in.

[5:17 PM] Liam Alexander - Atiera: This money could be better spent.

[5:17 PM] Larry Martin - Waterside Park: We don't hand out our services to random, unrelated nations.

[5:17 PM] Cameron - Atiera: OK, Larry. Point B doesn't stand. Does that mean we should still go along with this idea?

[5:18 PM] Leon Montan - Ponderosa Hills: It really can be.

[5:18 PM] Cameron - Atiera: I listed 5 points.

[5:18 PM] Larry Martin - Waterside Park: I concur with Mr. Alexander to a reasonable extent.

[5:18 PM] Sertor Valentinus - W. Sayville: Absolutely!

If we spent the money directly on our projects, as opposed to throwing it towards a white elephant.. the alliance would be leaps and bounds ahead.

I'd rather see practical outcomes, than see a fancy label that does nothing for our member states.

[5:18 PM] Larry Martin - Waterside Park: D has already been sorted within the act itself, has it not?

[5:18 PM] Larry Martin - Waterside Park: I'd argue that the Treasurer would need to know.

[5:19 PM] Cameron - Atiera: It does not matter if it has. I don't want the rest of the "organization" to be accountable to them.

[5:19 PM] Larry Martin - Waterside Park: Tyler already does this for other NPOs, and has stated he'd be willing to train any future treasurers.

[5:19 PM] Cameron - Atiera: It's a tax form.

[5:19 PM] Liam Alexander - Atiera: I concur with Cameron.

[5:19 PM] Sertor Valentinus - W. Sayville: Who would be the treasurer? We struggle to even find a safeguarding officer due to the limited pool of trustworthy adults.

[5:19 PM] Cameron - Atiera: It is a tax form for a micronational organization.

[5:19 PM] Cameron - Atiera: Think about it.

[5:20 PM] Cameron - Atiera: Tax form and micronational do not mix.

[5:20 PM] Cameron - Atiera: Just like the rest of the act

[5:20 PM] Larry Martin - Waterside Park: Look, I didn't write the act, I'm merely a spectator on this issue, but as far as I can tell, Tyler would be the treasurer.

[5:20 PM] Cameron - Atiera: I know you didn't write the act, but when you defend it, I start to get annoyed.

[5:20 PM] Liam Alexander - Atiera: It's quite honestly an insult to the spirit of micronationalism that we, self proclaimed nations, are being taxed by the damn United States!

[5:21 PM] Liam Alexander - Atiera: Yes. We are de-jure headquartered in Canada.

[5:21 PM] Larry Martin - Waterside Park: The Cupertino Alliance is not a nation, though?

[5:21 PM] Liam Alexander - Atiera: Or Aenderia.

[5:21 PM] Leon Montan - Ponderosa Hills: I mean, maybe?

[5:21 PM] Larry Martin - Waterside Park: It's... odd.

[5:21 PM] Cameron - Atiera: This argument creates obfuscation on obfuscation. This act creates a solution to a problem that does not exist.

[5:22 PM] Kevin "Big Kev" Doan - Blazdonia: I concur

[5:22 PM] Sertor Valentinus - W. Sayville: Though the term 'solution' is a bit of a falsehood.

[5:22 PM] Leon Montan - Ponderosa Hills: We have a .ca domain, and our titular headquarters are in effect Canadian, but there's not really anything more than that.

[5:22 PM] Liam Alexander - Atiera: The members of this alliance are the nations. We do not need to be taxed.

[5:22 PM] Liam Alexander - Atiera: We (the alliance)

[5:22 PM] Larry Martin - Waterside Park: And the member states wouldn't be taxed.

[5:22 PM] Liam Alexander - Atiera: For clarity.

[5:22 PM] Cameron - Atiera: That doesn't make any sense.

[5:23 PM] Cameron - Atiera: If we became an NPO, people are still getting taxed.

[5:23 PM] Cameron - Atiera: Funds to the organization wouldn't be taxed.

[5:23 PM] Cameron - Atiera: That's all that tax-exempt means.

[5:23 PM] Aidan Pierce- Bushistan: If you want low-taxes, register in Delaware

[5:23 PM] Liam Alexander - Atiera: No. Don't register at all.

[5:24 PM] Sertor Valentinus - W. Sayville: A major point of this is the timing.

We are currently underway the voting period of an election, the new administration of which takes seat in around a week.

Such a major change prior to a change is ludicrous. In certain countries, its considered illegal due to violation of electoral purdah.

It is best this is postponed to at least the first week of the next administration, as this is a major step. The next administration could have a very different view of where they want to see the alliance.

[5:24 PM] Larry Martin - Waterside Park: Full disclosure, I do not know how the US taxing systems work. I am not even American, I will pass on these complaints to Tyler, and I will see that they get addressed, however.

[5:26 PM] Larry Martin - Waterside Park: Sertor, I will allow you the floor for your motion.

[5:26 PM] Larry Martin - Waterside Park: Provided nothing else gets brought up before I move on.

[5:26 PM] Sertor Valentinus - W. Sayville: I wish to make clear I wish to address this session on two matters, one a complaint, and one a motion.

[5:26 PM] Liam Alexander - Atiera: Yeah. I can't bear to debate a "modified" version of this act again. This is stupid.

[5:26 PM] Larry Martin - Waterside Park: Alright.

[5:26 PM] Larry Martin - Waterside Park: Moving on.

[5:26 PM] Larry Martin - Waterside Park: Sertor, you have the floor.

[5:29 PM] Sertor Valentinus - W. Sayville: I would first like to lodge a complaint against the alliance, specifically the chair office and regional ministries for what I have coined 'triple session saturdays'.

The way the sessions have been held for the past few weeks have proved to be incredibly inconvenient, and I now struggle to attend sessions at all. I now resort to using the session allegedly for the American Sphere, as I cannot even use the European Sessions anymore.

With all three sessions on the same day, combined with the three-reading system, the debate often feels rushed and forced, and bears the risk of having potentially unsavoury legislation forced through Parliament with little to no time for debate to sink in.

I plead that this system ends, and sessions are once again spread throughout the week.

Saturday is prime time for restaurants, making it very much so inconvenient for many. In addition, I think it would be beneficial to re-introduce (controversially and disliked) the session timing form on a bi-weekly or more basis.

[5:36 PM] Liam Alexander - Atiera: Please.

[5:37 PM] Larry Martin - Waterside Park: I can't share exact details, but these triple sessions haven't raised internal complaints, but the planning has raised some minor confusion at times.

[5:38 PM] Larry Martin - Waterside Park: Especially following the introduction of the new charter.

[5:38 PM] Larry Martin - Waterside Park: Although that's probably just down to adjustment pains.

[5:38 PM] Larry Martin - Waterside Park: I do concur that sessions should be spread throughout the week.

[5:39 PM] Liam Alexander - Atiera: As do many of us.

[5:39 PM] James Murray - Avalonia: Sorry for the delay, I am present.

[5:39 PM] James Murray - Avalonia: I liked the old session format better, because if issues came up during the week they could be discussed in a more timely manner.

[5:40 PM] Larry Martin - Waterside Park: I will now give the floor to Sertor.

[5:40 PM] Sertor Valentinus - W. Sayville: Why, thank you!

[5:47 PM] Sertor Valentinus - W. Sayville: Here is the ... controversial motion I have yammered on about.

I would presume that delegations are aware that following Vishwamitras second departure from the Cupertino Alliance, their potential return has been left open.

If such an event were to occur, I would like to make it paramount that for the good of the alliance, an motion use the powers of the Individuals Veto Act be triggered against the former Chair of the Board, Dhrubajyoti Roy.
