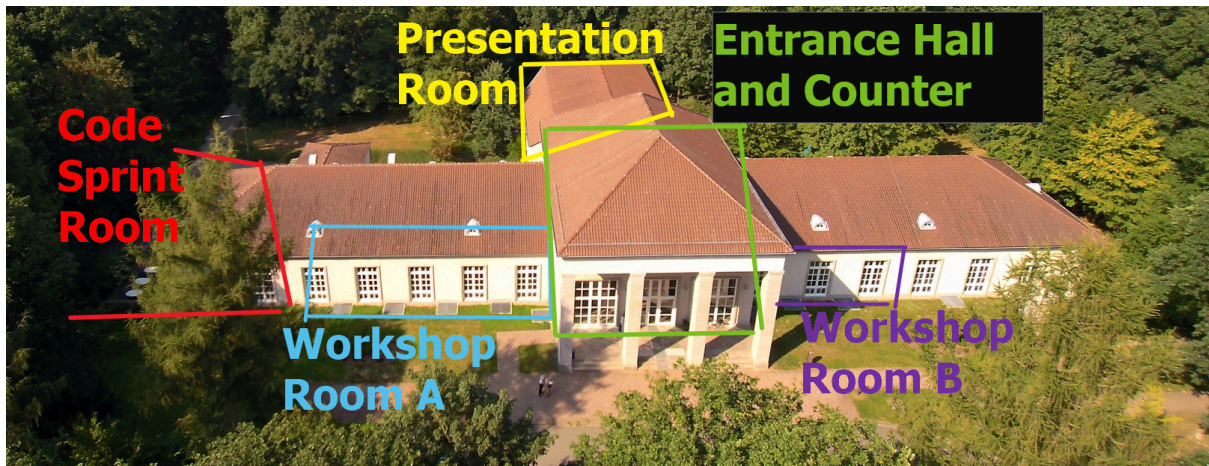
Venue

The venue is located on the [western outskirts of brunswick](#) (Braunschweig) germany. You can travel by bus to the campus entrance and will be shuttle served to the Thünen Forum by us at no costs.

This is an aerial of the relevant part of the Thünen Campus:



On the eastern (right) side is the entry and on the western (left) side the Thünen Forum. The Forum is this building with our rooms marked:



all of these three are 'ours' for the time of the summit.

Entrance Hall and Counter



The entrance hall (~205m²) will have a counter to register and get the summit documents like flyers, passwords for WLAN, etc. The hall also has tables with coffee, tea, fruits and cake for the breaks as self-service.

Presentation Room



This room (305m²) will be used for presentations. It has a beamer and microphones and enough place for up to 280 people. We will arrange the chairs according to the attendee count (see picture left for small, right for large) to get a good presentation and discussion experience. It has no electricity outlets for the auditorium.

Workshop Room A



It has enough space for ~45 persons (90m²) and is equipped with a beamer and tables to provide a workspace. It has electricity outlets in the middle of the room. Chairs and tables can be arranged in any manner.

Workshop Room B



Room B is the smaller (60m²) workshop room and has enough space for up to 14 persons and is equipped with a beamer and tables to provide a workspace. The room is equipped with video conference hardware. It has electricity outlets in the walls.

Code Sprint Room / Cafeteria



The code-sprint room (136m²) is the cafeteria of the forum and has glass windows to the terrace. Up to 60 persons could use this space. There are sitting as well as standing tables and chairs. The terrace can be used as work- and discussion-space, too. Since the kitchen is located 'behind' the cafeteria some of its personnel will move in and out from time to time.

Accommodations

The Thünen-Institute will try to reserve 40 hotel rooms in the city for attendees. After these are out the attendees shall book by themselves.

It is better to get a room in the city and traveling by bus to the entrance of the Thünen Campus, than to have a room near the campus and not being able to easily get to the inner city area.
