How does School Cash work?

• NO REFUNDS in any amount can be issued after February 1, 2026.

Chaperones

8th grade teachers, administrators, the school resource officer, and guidance counselors serve as chaperones. BMS does not allow parents to chaperone the trip. There will be one adult chaperone for every 10 students.

Students are kept with their friends as much as possible. If your child intentionally leaves their assigned group and chaperone for any reason while at a venue, you will be asked to come and get your child.

Medication

There probably hasn't been a medication situation that we haven't come across. HAHA! Specific directions regarding student medication, both over the counter and prescribed, will be given out closer to our trip date.

Hotels/Buses

- We will be using Young Transportation for our coach buses/drivers.
- Males and females will be on separate floors in the hotel.
 The opposite sex is not allowed on the other hotel floors at any time.
- While there may be a pool at our hotel, no swimming will be permitted.
- The utmost respect is expected at all times, not only to chaperones but hotel staff and other visitors staying in the hotel, as well.
- There will be 5 students in each room, 2 students per double bed and 1 on a fold-out couch.
- Students are allowed to choose with whom they room and are expected to figure out their roommate situations before January. That is when room sign-ups will be.
- It is expected that should an odd number arise, your student will welcome those peers warmly as roommates without disrespect.
- Hotel rooms have microwaves and mini-fridges. Students are welcome to pack snacks/drinks for the room accordingly.
- On the buses, girls sit on one side and boys sit on the other. However, students may sit with whomever they choose on their side.
- It is a long ride to D.C. and back, so we ask that your child bring plenty of snacks and drinks to tide them over. We will be making restroom stops, but are on a tight schedule so vending machines should not be planned upon.

Electronics

- Students are allowed to bring their electronics, however those items are the sole responsibility of the student.
- We have asked the tour company to be sure that the wifi is working on each bus. Sometimes, though, things go awry and so we aren't guaranteed that it will work perfectly the entire trip. Be sure to know what fees/charges your cell provider may charge if there is no wifi available.
- Please do not allow your child to pack gaming <u>CONSOLES</u> to be played in the hotel room. Handheld gaming systems are welcome!

• If any student takes/shares/posts inappropriate pictures or videos while on the trip, parents will be notified immediately and asked to come pick up their child. Please speak as a family about the seriousness of this.

Physical Activity

Repeat! We do not have chaperones free who can sit out with a student who cannot stay with the group. Each adult is responsible for ten other human beings. Please help your child understand this. We want students to have a trip they'll never forget - for all the right reasons!
