How to write sources in the text need to clearly indicate the name of the author and source citations based on the use of the Mendeley application such as: (Retnawati, 2014).

The degree of material up-to-date is referred to by looking at the proportion of the past 10 years and referring to the primary literature. Problems and objectives, and the usefulness of research/creation written narratively in paragraphs, do not need to be given special subtitles

The Introduction is written with Palatino Linotype-12 upright, with a space of 1.5. Each paragraph begins with a word that protrudes into 5 digits, or about 1 cm from the left edge of each column.

Literature Review

A literature review is a key component in research, primarily aimed at demonstrating a deep understanding of the research topic. When compiling a literature review, it's crucial to use relevant and up-to-date sources, presented in an organized and logical manner. The literature review not only reveals to the reader what is already known about the topic but also how your research adds to or expands this understanding, demonstrating your study's contribution to the field of knowledge.

METHOD

It is also essential to explain the data analysis process, whether through statistical methods for quantitative research or approaches like thematic analysis for qualitative studies, and to include how the research addressed ethical considerations, including participant privacy protection and data use.

The writing of the methodology should be transparent and detailed, allowing readers to assess the reliability and validity of the research and facilitating replication by other researchers. This includes justifying every methodological choice, from sample selection to analysis techniques. Such transparency not only demonstrates scientific diligence and academic integrity but also strengthens the readers' trust in the research findings. Thus, the methodology section plays a crucial role in establishing a solid foundation for the entire study, ensuring that the research can be followed, verified, or even extended by future research.

RESULTS

When writing the Results section of a journal article, researchers should focus on objectively presenting the data and findings of their research without including interpretations. This requires the findings to be presented clearly, concisely, and logically, often supported by visual aids such as tables, charts, and figures to facilitate reader understanding. Priority should be given to the most significant or surprising results, ensuring all relevant data are presented. This presentation should be conducted in a manner that allows readers to easily follow the flow of research findings, highlighting the key outcomes discovered during the study.

Tables are written in the middle or at the end of each text. If the width of the table is not enough to write in half a page, then it can be written one full page. The title of the table is written from the center, all words start with uppercase, except for

conjunctions. If more than one line is written in a single space. For example, you can see Table 1.

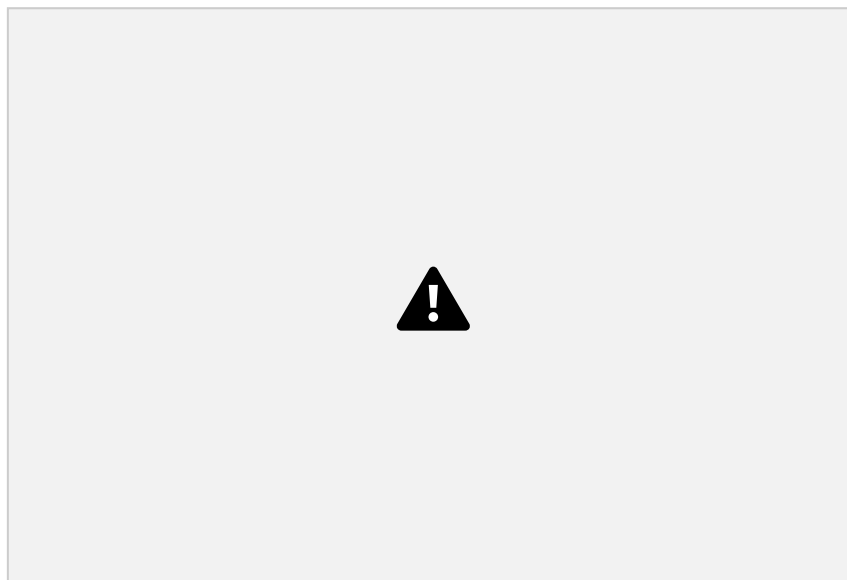


Figure 1. Caption for Figure should be Below the figure

connecting them back to the existing literature. This is an opportunity to explore the meaning, significance, and implications of the research findings, as well as to highlight the uniqueness or new aspects brought about by the study. The discussion should also include acknowledgments of the research's limitations and suggestions for future research, ensuring that readers gain a comprehensive understanding of the study's contribution to the field and the questions that remain open.

CONCLUSION

The conclusion states the answers to the problems that are the focus of the discussion. It can be a generalization of findings according to the research problem, it can also be a recommendation for the next step.
