

## **Old Orchard Farm Horse Partnership Guidelines**

This document outlines the responsibilities and privileges associated with different types of relationships you may have with horses at Old Orchard Farm.

#### **Horse or Pony Ownership**

- You, or someone close to you, has either bred and retained a foal or purchased a horse or pony for you.
- You are the primary decision-maker regarding your horse or pony.
- You are responsible for paying board, veterinary, and farriery costs.
- You may choose your own veterinarian and farrier, and you are responsible for arranging their services.
- You decide how often you ride (coordination with Linda is recommended, especially during the winter when arena space is limited).
- You provide all tack, brushes, blankets, and equipment necessary for your horse or pony.

#### Leasing a Horse or Pony

- You do not own the horse or pony, but leasing is the closest option to ownership without a purchase.
- Typically, you pay a portion of the horse's value (commonly one-third) for an agreed period (usually one year).
- Many lease agreements include an insurance policy, either provided by the owner or required of the lessee.
- Decisions regarding care and use of the horse are made in consultation with the owner and your trainer.
- You are responsible for board, veterinary, and farriery costs.
- Choice of vet and farrier is made with the owner and trainer; in some cases, the owner may stipulate specific professionals.
- You typically decide how often and when you ride, though lease terms may include restrictions.

You provide tack, brushes, blankets, and other equipment.

#### Part-Boarder – Privately Owned Horse or Pony

- You do not own the horse or pony.
- The owner makes all decisions regarding feed, turnout, and care.
- You negotiate the number of rides directly with the owner.
- The owner pays board; you contribute a portion (often half). Veterinary and farriery costs remain the owner's responsibility, though you may be asked to share expenses.
- The owner typically provides tack, brushes, blankets, and other equipment.
- No jumping without a coach or owner present.

### Part-Boarder – OOF Owned Horse or Pony

- You do not own the horse or pony.
- Your payment covers only a portion of the horse's monthly costs.
- Feeding, turnout, and care decisions are made by Linda. Any concerns must be directed to her.
- You are not responsible for veterinary costs.
- You are entitled to two practice rides and one paid lesson per week (ride times arranged with Linda).
- Horses may be used by other riders when you are not scheduled, including multiple rides per day at Linda's discretion.
- Old Orchard Farm provides tack, brushes, blankets, and equipment.
- No jumping without a coach present.

## Show Part-Board – OOF Owned Horse or Pony

- All conditions of OOF part-boarding apply.
- Show part-boards include:
  - No horse usage fee at OOF-hosted shows.
  - No day fee for horse use at off-property shows.
- Show part-boards are arranged **annually** (not monthly) to ensure fairness and consistency throughout the show season.
- No jumping without a coach present.

# **Project Horses or Ponies**

OOF often has young or green horses needing further education. Riders with sufficient skill may work with these horses, ranging from groundwork to backing, riding, and showing.

- All interactions with non-school horses must be approved by Linda.
- Eligibility to work with a project horse is determined by Linda.
- Plans for the horse's training must be discussed and approved by Linda.
- Working with a project horse is **not a lease or ownership** arrangement and does not grant management privileges.
- Project horses are not exclusive—others may also be assigned to ride or handle them.
- The goal is to prepare horses to be useful riding horses for OOF programs, clients, or eventual sale. Once they reach a certain stage, they will be integrated into the school, leased, or sold, at which point your involvement may end.
- Riders unwilling to accept these terms should pursue ownership, lease, or part-board instead.
- No jumping without a coach present.
