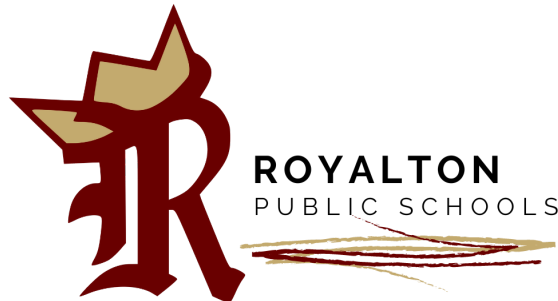

**Benton Communications Scholarship**—Benton Communications will award four \$750 scholarships to seniors, whose parents or legal guardians have telephone service with Benton Communications, (telephone number prefixes 393, 387, 355, 294, or 556). To apply for a scholarship, the senior will need to meet the following criteria: This scholarship is open to multiple applicants/schools.

- Parents or legal guardians have telephone service with Benton Communications.
- Grade point average must be at least 2.5 (transcript needs to be included).
- Short essay of 50-100 words of their career plans.

**Compeer Financial High School Senior Scholarship** – Scholarships to MN Graduates. Provides 1 individual scholarship to students within the 144-county services territory in Illinois, Minnesota and Wisconsin of Compeer Financial. The scholarship is for graduating high school seniors who have been accepted or will enroll at a university, college or community/technical college. Eligible applicants will have a 3.0 GPA (on a 4.0 scale), reside in Compeer's 144-county services territory, have a designated agriculture major or interest in an agriculture-related field, or have an agricultural or rural background. Selection will be based on a combination of:

- Academic achievement
- Agricultural and community youth organization involvement
- Essay
- Possess a GPA of 3.0 or better
- Special consideration will be given to students of parents who do business with Compeer Financial.
- All applicants will be judged blindly by an internal committee of Compeer team members.

**Crow Wing Power Scholarships** –The number of scholarships awarded will be determined by the number of applicants – scholarship amounts vary from **\$1,000 - \$1,500**.

**Foundation for Rural Service (FRS) Scholarship in conjunction with Benton Communications** The Foundation for Rural Service in cooperation with the (NTCA) – The Rural Broadband Association, seeks to sustain and enhance the quality of life throughout Rural America by advancing an understanding of rural telecommunications issues. In keeping with its mission, furthering the education of rural youth is one of the foundation’s primary focuses. Benton Communications is a member of NTCA and is proud to support FRS in this worthy endeavor. Should a student from the service area be selected to receive one of the 30 scholarships (\$2,000 each), Benton Communications will contribute an additional \$500 to this scholarship bringing the total one-time scholarship award to \$2,500. Students may also be eligible for four FRS Staurulakis Family Scholarships valued at \$5,000 each or two TMS Scholarships for \$1,500 each. - MCT will award at least 2 scholarships for at least \$500.00. MCT reserves the right to award additional scholarships and/or dollar amount depending on the funds they have

available. All scholarship decisions will be made by the MCT scholarship committee and are final.

### **Morrison County Pheasants Forever Clarence Lundquist Memorial Scholarship \$250**

The Morrison County Chapter of Pheasants Forever (MCPF), a non-profit organization promoting sound stewardship and conservation of wildlife and natural resources and associated public recreation, announces the availability of natural resource management scholarships for graduating seniors. Scholarships will be awarded to graduating seniors chosen from among the following Morrison County Schools: Little Falls, Pierz, Royalton, Swanville and Upsala.

- Applicants must have maintained a high school grade point average of 3.0 or higher, plan on attending a higher learning institution following graduation, and be entering into the field of wildlife science, natural resource management or a closely related field (e.g. environmental science, ecology, forestry, fisheries management, or conservation biology).
- Recipients will be chosen on the basis of a) scholastic and school achievement, b) home and community involvement, c) an essay describing their educational & career goals, and d) at least one letter of reference from an employer, teacher, coach, or school counselor. Preference will be given to applicants who have worked or volunteered for an agency or organization in the conservation, environmental or natural resource fields. Please submit a letter of reference from a resource professional you've worked or volunteered for. Letters of recommendation from a coach, counselor or teacher will also be considered. Referees must address, among other things, why they feel the applicant would be likely to succeed in wildlife science, natural resource management or a closely related field.
- The selection committee will comprise of at least 3 members of the MCPF committee, including at least 2 natural resource professionals.
- Payment of scholarship will be made upon successful completion of first quarter or semester from the institution of the student's choice and with proof of registration for second quarter or semester.

- Application for this scholarship must be completed and returned to your area High School Guidance Department.
- Recipients will be chosen on the basis of scholastic involvement, home and community involvement, and a short essay describing their educational/career goals to include the impact the military has/had on achieving your goal.
- Payment of a \$500.00 scholarship will be made to the recipient upon completion of their 1<sup>st</sup> semester of the 1<sup>st</sup> year.

**Northern Co-op Foundation Scholarship** –Scholarships could be awarded to RHS students! Scholarships will be awarded to students from Minnesota, Wisconsin, North or South Dakota who are seniors in or a graduate of high school and who show potential for significant contribution to Cooperative organizations. They must be enrolled full time at an institution of higher education and will be taking a course in business or economics which studies the principles of Cooperatives. If courses are not offered, applicants must submit a letter agreeing to take such a course at another college or university. This letter needs to be included at the time of application submission. Applicants not selected one year, may re-apply in subsequent years! Scholarship Application Requirements:

- Students must be a member of a cooperative and must be a high school senior furthering your education.
- Students must be taking a course that studies business, economics or the principles of Cooperatives.
- Students must be in the four state areas of Minnesota, Wisconsin, North/South Dakota.
- Students must submit three letters of reference, one from your local Co-op, plus two others, and must reach the Scholarship Committee by Feb 1. These letters are the responsibility of the applicant. No application will be considered without the three letters of reference.

### **P.E.O. Chapter BB MN Education Scholarship Fund Application Chapter BB (1) \$500**

P.E.O. is a philanthropic organization where women celebrate the advancement of women; educate women through scholarships, grants, awards, loans and stewardship; and motivate women to achieve their highest aspirations.
