

DACA Renewals Now! Education Campaign Toolkit

Background

The Deferred Action for Childhood Arrival (DACA) program is a life-changing program which provides temporary protection from deportation as well as a two-year renewable work permit to eligible individuals brought to the U.S. before the age of 16. However, since the Trump Administration's termination of the DACA program in 2017, DACA recipients have lived with an uncertain future. Thanks to lawsuits and injunctions in favor of the program, U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) is still accepting DACA renewal applications. However, it is no longer accepting new applications for DACA, leaving thousands of eligible individuals (including current high school students who were too young to apply previously) unable to access relief. Furthermore, the Trump Administration has made it clear through words and actions that it intends to end DACA renewals once and for all, and has petitioned the Supreme Court to review lower court decisions that enabled renewals to continue.

The #DACARenewalsNow campaign's mission is to inform and empower DACA recipients to renew, and drive additional resources to them and organizations providing renewal assistance in the field.
