


Chapter XII

And God said, "Let the St. Paul Lutheran congregation welcome new staff and celebrate a new organ."

In September 1975, St. Paul welcomes new intern, Warren Jacobs, who is in his third year at Wartburg Seminary, Dubuque, IA. He will preach Sunday services and help in the music program. He a native of Burlington, WI. His wife Sandra, is from Schaumberg, IL and will teach at Royce School.

A year later, on September 5, 1976, St. Paul welcomes Richard and Rebecca Bolz as Richard will be an intern and Rebecca teaches at Waterman school. Richard was ordained May 28, 1978 at First English Lutheran, Peoria, IL. Richard and Rebecca served as missionaries in Madagascar. Unfortunately, Richard died on August 24, 1979 as a result of an auto accident in Madagascar.

St. Paul welcomed their next intern, Kathy Boadwine on September 4,

1977. She is a student at Wartburg Seminary, Dubuque, IA. Kathy is from Watertown, ND. The following week, St. Paul honored women in professional life, including Kathy, as well as



Dorothy and Doris Mishler, who have served St. Paul as part-time secretaties for 30 years, and Dorothy Rohr as parish secretary for many years. On June 17, 1979, Kathy Boadwine is ordained in Watertown, ND and becomes one of less than 50 women in the ALC.

On September 24, 1978, Pastor Humlie resigns. The following spring

on April 22, 1979, William H. Kahlenberg is installed as St. Paul's next Pastor. He served St. Paul from 1978 to 1986. His first call was at St. Paul Lutheran, Dearborn, MI, 1964-72. He then moved to Hamburg, W. Germany, on a stipend from the ALC, to study history and theology and co-pastor at a suburb of Hamburg.

installed as Associate Pastor at St. Paul. She was ordained on August 31, 1980 at Trinity Lutheran, Wauseon, OH. She will serve St. Paul from 1980 to 1985. As one of the first women pastors in the area, she provided the area with many interesting articles through the *Beloit Daily News*.

Bill and Margaret Rau are honored as the *Beloit Daily News* Volunteers of the Month on April 26, 1982. The Raus have have delivered Meals on Wheels to shut ins for about a dozen years. They also are Red Cross volunteers delivering Blood Bank blood to Madison. They also started the "Golden Age Club" in 1958 for individuals 55 years old and



older. The club sends get well cards, helps with Christmas Cheer


boxes and presents birthday candles to participants at each monthly meeting.

St. Paul celebrates its 110th Anniversary with a variety of activities in 1984. On May 20th, Trinity Lutheran Choir, Madison, sings at St. Paul. July 29th looks back on fond memories with an old fashioned service, invitation to past interns and pastors, and an afternoon chicken barbeque with live music. On October 7, Bishop A. C. Schumacher attends worship at St. Paul, followed by a catered meal. The Rev. Larry Froemming, past intern and now Pastor at Calvary Lutheran, delivered the sermon.



Pastor Kahlenberg preaches his last sermon on April 13, 1986. On Sunday July 12, 1987, the Rev. Adam Meidinger, the church's interim minister for the past 15 months, installs Pastor Charles Larson as St. Paul's new pastor. Pastor Chuck will serve St. Paul for 12 years from

1987-1999 along with his wife Joan. Pastor Chuck has ministered in Kenosha, Poynette, Merimac and most recently Burlington.

In 1985, St. Paul began a Pipe Organ Project to install a new pipe

organ with Don Diestelmeier of the Freeport Organ Company, as consultant and builder. The new console comes from Hartford, CT, the wind chests from Milwaukee, and the reed and flue

At the beginning of 1988, at Eaton Chapel of Beloit College, over 700 Lutherans gathered from 9 area congregations, to celebrate the newly formed Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). Bishop Lowell Mays of the new South Central Synod of Wisconsin located in Madison spoke at the event. On January 6, 1990, the Epiphany Service featured The Three Kings, Dennis Leppla,
