Thank you for trying. My questions are:

-Why does the VPC use the definition it uses for "mass shooting"?

As noted on the website, a mass shooting is defined as the killing of three or more people consistent with the federal definition contained in the Investigative Assistance for Violent Crimes Act of 2012.

-How does the VPC verify that the shootings in the study were committed by concealed carry permit holders?

The information in Concealed Carry Killers is based on news reports on these incidents and subsequent legal proceedings. This is the best information available because detailed information on fatal incidents involving concealed carry killers is rarely available from official sources, and some states in fact bar the release of such information.

-What's the process by which new incidents are added to the study? Are incidents ever later found to be inaccurate and removed?

As noted above, Concealed Carry Killers is updated regularly based on information in news reports and subsequent legal proceedings. A small number of incidents are found to be in self-defense or no verdict is reached at trial, and these incidents are then removed from the study.
