A STATUTE

To Define the Symbols and Their Care.

SECTION I. SHORT TITLE.

This statute may be cited as the “Statute on Symbols and Their Care”.

SECTION II. DEFINITIONS.

- (A) As per the Law on the Imperial Foundations passed by the First Imperial Congress on the 1st of January 2024, Chapter X, Subsection A, the imperial symbols have been defined, which was amended as the Basic Laws of the Auguric Republic by the interim government on the 24th May 2024.
- (B) Inspired by our Atlian Brothers and Sisters in their passage of a symbols law, the Court of Bainbridge-Dearmad-Fundy has requested the Sovereign Council of Ste. Croix draft and pass a Tozarian symbols law.

SECTION III. GENERAL SYMBOLS

- (A) The Auguric Republic shall have two national coat of arms, a general and a simple, with both being defined as;
 - (a) General;
 - (i) The general coat of arms shall be defined as, 1st tierced in Fesse arg or arg a Raven Volant arg small smaller smaller much smaller 2nd az three fleur de lys or 3rd Per Pale gu or a crozier arg small smaller higher 4th arg Cross gu, over quarters a

escutcheon sa a Fishing Boat or small small impaled with Tierced in Fesse purpure arg or. Behind all is a two headed pelican, left pelican crowned looking right, left pelican uncrowned looking down, biting breast. Around the two headed pelican's neck is the ribbon and medal of the Royal Order of Dearmad-Fundy.

(b)Simple;

- (i) The simple coat of arms shall be defined as; bicolor of orange and purple, with a Pelican and her Piety on in the middle white.

(B) The Auguric Republic shall have two national flags, a state and civil, with both being defined as;

(i) State;

- 1) The state flag shall be a white field with a border of tricolor of purple, white and orange. In the center shall be a shield, bicolor of purple and orange, with a Pelican and Her Piety in white in the middle.

(ii) Civil;

- 1) The civil flag shall be a tricolor of purple, white and orange.

(b)The two national flags shall be made by screen printing, or hand made by fabric made up of either woven wool, cotton, polyester, nylon or silk.

(c)The two national flags shall be rectangular in shape, with the ration of the height and width of all two being three two.

(d)The standard sizes of the two national flags shall be as follows;

- (i) 60 x 90 cm - 2' x 3'
- (ii) 90 x 150 cm - 3' x 5'
- (iii) 120 x 180 cm - 4' x 6'

- (iv) 150 x 240 cm - 5' x 8'
- (v) 180 x 300 cm - 6' x 10'
- (vi) 240 x 360 cm - 8' x 12'
- (vii) 300 x 450 cm - 10' x 15'
- (viii) 360 x 540 cm - 12' x 18'
- (ix) 450 x 750 cm - 15' x 25'
- (x) 600 x 900 cm - 20' x 30'

(C) The official name of the nation shall be accepted as such;

(a) As defined by the Basic Law of the Auguric Republic, the official name of the nation shall be recognized as such;

(b) Official:

(i) The Auguric Republic of Isturus and the Voiquila,

(c) Short form:

(i) Auguric Republic;

(ii) Isturus and Voiquila;

(iii) Isturus and the Voiquila;

(d) These names shall be recognized as interchangeable and equal to one another. Official names shall be used for diplomatic or formal purposes and short form names shall be used for conversation or informal documentation.

(e) As per subsection E within this section, the official and short form names of the nation in the national languages shall be recognized as such;

(i) French;

1) Official;

a) La République Augurique d'Isturus et la Voiquila,

2) Short;

a) République Augurique,

- b) Isturus et Voiqila,
- c) Isturus et la Voiqila,

(ii) Spanish;

1) Official;

- a) La República Augurica de Isturus y la Voiqila,

2) Short;

- a) República Augurica,
- b) Isturus y Voiqila,
- c) Isturus y la Voiqila,

(D) The currency of the nation shall be recognized as such;

(a) The national currency shall be that of the Stater Yen, which will be pegged to the gold found within the national reserves within the Imperial Bank of Salacia.

(i) The nation shall recognize ceremonial currencies as collector's items only, with the Androsian Flaid and Salacian Penguin as the only ceremonial currencies within the nation.

(ii) Due to the nature of the nation as a micronationalist venture, the currencies of the nations in which the Auguric Republic holds territory shall be recognized as legal tender.

(iii) Treaty currencies as defined by the Treaty of the Northern Seas shall be affirmed as legal tender within the nation, with exchange rates defined by the Imperial Bank of Salacia every three months. Further treaty currencies shall be recognized either by amendment or by a new treaty between the Auguric Republic and other parties.

(b) The Imperial Bank of Salacia shall be the only national bank of the nation, with it being under the Sovereign Council of St. Croix. The bank shall be located at Alberminister, Parish of Vespucci.

- (i) The Imperial Bank of Salacia shall have two offices, the Alberminister Mint in Alberminister, and the Acadia Mint in Elenora-sur-Acadie.
 - (ii) The presider of the Imperial Bank of Salacia shall be granted the title of “Master of the Mint” for the duration of their term.
- (c) The Strathrick Exchange shall be recognized as the national stock exchange, with further development regarding its procedures and policies being defined no later than 1st of June 2029.
- (d) The National Commission for Economic Policies shall be formed as a commission of the Sovereign Council of Ste. Croix and shall meet at least once per session. The commission shall work with the Imperial Bank of Salacia and the House of Bainbridge-Dearmad-Fundy to define and develop the regional economy of the nation.
- (E) The languages of the nation shall be accepted as such;
 - (a) Languages officially recognized within the halls of the Tozarian Government shall include; English, French, Spanish, and Tjekopinan. Esperanto shall be recognized in times of officials and citizens not speaking a common language. Esperanto translation shall be accepted through Google Translate, or official Esperanto translators. Everyone has the right to use any of these languages in any proceedings within the Government.
 - (i) Should another language be represented by ten percent or more of the population, it shall be recommended for inclusion as an official language.
 - (b) Minority languages shall be defined as languages spoken by under ten percent of the nation, or of cultural importance. These communities hold the right to request special documents in their language. As well

as regional recognition within the territorial communities as official languages.

- (i) The minority languages recognized within the Tozarian Government shall include; Icelandic.

(c) English shall be recognized as the de facto language of the Government, with other translations to official languages being done when requested. In cases where a discrepancy exists between translations, the English translation shall prevail.

- (i) All proceedings on all levels of the Government shall be done in English, unless otherwise requested for another official language to be used. In these cases, all public information shall then be translated into English.

- (ii) All public forms shall be presented in all official languages, the option to take a document in any official language shall be a protected right under the right to freedom of speech.

- 1) If an individual declines to pick a language for a form, or proceeding, the officer involved shall pick the language estimated to be the best option.

(d) Within diplomatic relations, the common language of both parties shall be accepted for the official treaty or other documents. If a common language is not present, the official language of the other party shall be the official language of the treaty. In those cases, the treaty shall then be translated into English for public record within the nation.

(e) Signage within the nation shall be done in English, French and Spanish, international zones or public community spaces shall be required to use English and Esperanto instead.

(F) The official motto and principle shall be recognized as such;

- (a) As per the Basic Law the national motto is: “Pietas, Fides et Dispensatio”. In accordance with subsection E of this section the motto shall be translated into the national languages;
 - (i) English: Duty, Faith and Stewardship
 - (ii) French: Piété, foi et Intendance,
 - (iii) Spanish: Piedad, fe y Mayordomía,
 - (b) As per the Basic Law, the national principle is; “By the citizens, for the citizens”.
- (G) The official oath to the crown shall be recognized as such;
- (a) “I do solemnly swear that I will be faithful and bear honor and allegiance to His Imperial and Serene Majesty Ambrose I, the House of Bainbridge-Dearmad-Fundy and his successors, according to law. So help me *insert god(s), goddess(es) of choice*.”
- (H) The national flora and fauna of the nation shall be accepted as such;
- (a) The national tree shall be the Balsam Fir,
 - (b) The national sea creature shall be the Rock Crab,
 - (c) The national reptile shall be the Yellow Spotted Salamander,
 - (d) The national mythical animal shall be the Two Headed Pelican,
 - (e) The national fruit shall be the Pink Lady Apple,
 - (f) The national flower shall be the Trillium,
 - (g) The national fish shall be the Rainbow Trout,
 - (h) The national mammal shall be the Domesticated Cat,
 - (i) The national bird shall be the American White Pelican,
- (I) Other national symbols of the nation shall be accepted as such;
- (a) The national anthem shall be Plus Rien,
 - (b) The national colors shall be Purple, White, and Orange,
 - (c) The national dish shall be the Chicken Cheese Quesadilla,

- (d) The national founders shall be;
 - (i) Ambrose Dearmad of the House of Bainbridge-Dearmad-Fundy,
 - (ii) Thomas Bainbridge of the House of Bainbridge,
 - (iii) Luis Marcel of the House of Ramvil,
- (e) The national goddess shall be Diana of Greco-Roman Culture,
- (f) The national patron saint shall be The Virgin Mary as Our Lady of the Sugar Maple,
- (g) The national personification shall be the Aesop the Augur,
- (h) The national sports shall be Hockey and Association Football.
- (J) Other national flags of the nation shall include;
 - (a) War;
 - (i) The war flag of the Auguric Republic shall be defined by a field of seven bands of purple, white, purple.
 - (b) Naval;
 - (i) The naval flag of the Auguric Republic shall be defined by a white nordic cross, bordered with black across a purple field.
 - (c) Merchant;
 - (i) The merchant flag of the Auguric Republic shall be defined as a white field with a purple St. George's Cross in the middle.
 - (d) Diplomatic;
 - (i) The diplomatic flag of the Auguric Republic shall be defined as a white field with a yellow circle in the middle, with a purple circle off center slightly smaller than the yellow circle. In the middle of the yellow circle shall be a smaller white circle, and an even smaller purple circle in the middle.
 - (e) Regional flags;
 - (i) The Voiquila;

1) The Voiqila Parish flag shall be defined as a tricolor of blue, yellow and purple. Between the tricolors, shall be a thin white line. In the middle of the flag shall be a small Trillium bordered of black, with white petals, green leaves and yellow five dots in the middle of the flower.

(ii) Petrioam;

1) The Petrioam Parish flag shall be defined as a tricolor of black, yellow and black. In the left side of the flag shall be alternating yellow, black yellow crescents.

(iii) Shegnhoac;

1) The Shegnhoac Parish flag shall be a bicolor of blue and white. The bicolor shall be split top to bottom with a wavy pattern of 13 crests. In the bottom left shall be a white and black trillium. In the top right shall be a yellow and black castle with one door, two windows and three towers, with the middle tower slightly higher than the other two towers.

(iv) The Transaintecroix;

1) The Transaintecroix Parish flag shall be defined as a tricolor of blue, white and purple. In the top left canton, there shall be a gray crescent. In the bottom right canton, there shall be three stars, one not rotated and the other two rotated 45 percent.

(v) Vespucci;

1) The Vespucci Parish flag shall be defined as a tricolor of yellow, white and turquoise. In between the yellow and white, shall be a blue thin line, and in between the white and turquoise shall be a purple thin line. In the center

shall be a shield bordered in gold, with a blue and red bicolor. In the center of the bicolor shall be a green and white star.

(vi) Rivlusie;

- 1) The Rivlusie Parish flag shall be defined as a white field with a blue nordic cross, with a thin border of red, with a larger border of yellow in between the red and blue. In the top left canton shall be a blue cross, with each point being three points.

(vii) Village;

- 1) The Voiqila;

- a) The village flags of the Parish of The Voiqila shall include the parish flag in the top left canton, with the shield of the village in the middle of the right side the flag, with a field of green.

- 2) Petrioam;

- a) The village flags of the Parish of Petrioam shall include the parish flag in the top left canton, with the shield of the village in the middle of the right side the flag, with a field of green.

- 3) Shegnhoac;

- a) The village flags of the Parish of Shegnhoac shall include the parish flag in the top left canton, with the shield of the village in the middle of the right side the flag, with a field of purple.

- 4) The Transaintecroix;

- a) The village flags of the Parish of The Transaintecroix shall include the parish flag in the

top left canton, with the shield of the village in the middle of the right side the flag, with a field of purple.

5) Vespucci;

- a) The village flags of the Parish of Vespucci shall include the parish flag in the top left canton, with the shield of the village in the middle of the right side the flag, with a field of red.

6) Rivlusie;

- a) The village flags of the Parish of Rivlusie shall include the parish flag in the top left canton, with the shield of the village in the middle of the right side the flag, with a field of red.

(K) Imperial crowns;

(a) Tozarian;

- (i) The Tozarian Crown shall be defined as a golden base, with 18 points, with golden maple leafs adorned every fourth point. In the base shall be 16 small pearls. In the center of the crown shall be an orange top, over which shall be four cross beams pointing to the middle. In the middle shall be a golden hound dog pointing to the left.

(b) Tozarenan;

- (i) The Tozarenan Crown shall be defined as a golden base, with 18 points, with a wreath of coral every ninth point, in the middle, which in the center shall be a small pearl. In the base shall be 16 small pearls. In the center of the crown shall be an orange top, over which shall be four cross beams pointing to

the middle. In the middle shall be a golden emperor penguin pointing to the left.

(c) High nobility;

(i) Shall be amended and defined upon completion of the high nobility crowns.

(d) Lower nobility;

(i) Shall be amended and defined upon completion of the lower nobility crowns.

(e) Civil;

(i) Shall be amended and defined upon completion of the civil nobility crowns.

SECTION IV. MILITARY

(A) Military flags;

(a) National Constabulary:

(i) The flag of the National Constabulary shall be defined as a red field, with a blue bottom in the lower fourth of the field, with a golden band separating the red and blue fields, which is a fourth of the size of the blue field. In the top left canton shall be the arms of the National Constabulary, which is a blue and gold axe upright with a fish hook laying flat, with the hook pointing to the right, as is the axehead.

(B) Military arms;

(a) National Constabulary:

(i) The arms of the National Constabulary shall be defined as a blue bordered and golden center axe upright with a fish hook

laying flat, with the hook pointing to the right, as is the
axehead.

(C) Military customs;

(a) National Constabulary:

(i) The National Constabulary shall hold the right and power to define its own customs as they arise, and shall ensure they follow the Basic Laws of the Auguric Republic.

(ii) Should these customs break the Basic Laws of the Auguric Republic, the National Constabulary shall be placed on hiatus as an investigation occurs by the Sovereign Council of Ste. Croix, House of Bainbridge-Dearmad-Fundy and the People's Court of Hache. Of which, shall hold the right to define the punishments for any wrongdoing found.

SECTION V. PUBLIC DISPLAY AND USE

(A) There shall be no restriction on the display of the national flags and coat of arms by members of the general public, private organizations, educational institutions, and similar organizations. Except to the extent provided within this act, or future clarifying amendments or acts.

(a) The national flags and coat of arms shall not be used for commercial purposes, unless otherwise approved by the Imperial Congress.

(b) The national flags shall not be dipped in salute to any person or thing.

(B) Disrespect for the national flags and the coat of arms means and includes;

(a) Indignity offered to either symbols;

- (b) Flying the flags at half-mast except on occasions on which the flags have been requested to be flown at half-mast by the government;
 - (c) Using the flag as drapery in any form except for funerals where the government has accepted a request to do so;
 - (d) Using the flags or coat of arms as a portion of a costume, or non-government sanctioned uniforms;
 - (e) Putting any description on the national flags, or the coat of arms;
 - (f) Allowing the flags to touch the ground, or trail in water intentionally;
 - (g) Using the flags as a covering for vehicles, buildings, desks or statues;
 - (h) Intentionally hanging the national flags or coat of arms upside down;
- (C) A member of the public, private organization or an educational institution may hoist and display the national flags and coat of arms on all days and occasions, ceremonial or otherwise. These shall be consistent with the dignity of the national flags and coat of arms;
- (a) The national flags and coat of arms, whenever displayed shall occupy the position of honor and be placed with distinction;
 - (b) A damaged national flag or coat of arms shall not be displayed;
 - (c) A national flag shall never be flown from a single mast with another flag;
 - (d) The national flags and coat of arms shall never be flown or displayed on any vehicle unless it is a government owned vehicle;
 - (e) No other flags shall be placed higher than or above the national flags when flown. Flags may be flown equal to one another during state visits, or other diplomatic events;
 - (f) Paper flags shall be made for special events, however these flags shall not be thrown away or tossed on the ground, and shall be granted the same respect a national flag or coat of arms is discarded, as is defined within this act;

- (g) When the national flags or coat of arms are damaged or soiled, it shall be destroyed as per the instructions defined within this act;

SECTION VI. GOVERNMENT DISPLAY AND USE

- (A) This section shall not apply to military stations and other military sanctioned installations, which shall have its own rules and regulations for the display of national symbols, as well as military specific symbols.
- (B) The state flag and coat of arms shall be flown and shown on the headquarters and residences of missions and posts abroad. This shall only be applicable where it is respectful and tradition for diplomatic and consular representatives to fly their national flags and coats of arms at these installations.
- (C) It shall be mandatory for all other governments and their various agencies to follow the provisions set forth in this part.
- (a) On all occasions for official display, only the select flag adhering to the specifications set forth by the Imperial Congress shall be used. On all other occasions, and as it is recommended, only such flags of respectable size are to be flown.

SECTION VII. NATIONAL FLAGS AND coat of arms CEREMONIES

- (A) Folding the flag;
- (a) State;
- (i) Hold the flag taut with enough people on each side;
- (ii) The hoist side shall be folded in a line until even with the start of the trillium;

- (iii) The fly side shall follow the same as the hoist side;
- (iv) Fold the hoist side under the flag;
- (v) Fold the fly side under the flag, under the hoist side;
- (vi) Roll the flag from the bottom up to the top;
- (vii) Wrap the flag in white rope, tie off with a square knot.

(b) Civil;

- (i) Hold the flag taut with enough people on each side;
- (ii) Fold the bottom until it meets the middle of the tricolor;
- (iii) Fold the top until it meets the middle of the tricolor;
- (iv) Roll the flag from the bottom up to the top;
- (v) Wrap the flag in white rope, tie off with a square knot.

(c) Military;

- (i) The National Constabulary flag and its separate branches shall be folded in line with the style of the state flag;
- (ii) Units and formations of the National Constabulary shall define their own folding tradition for their flags.

(d) Other governmental;

- (i) Hold the flag taut for enough people on each side;
- (ii) Fold the flag in half by the hoist side;
- (iii) Fold the flag in half by the fly side;
- (iv) Fold the flag in half by the bottom;
- (v) Fold the flag in half by the top;
- (vi) Fold the flag in half by the hoist side;
- (vii) Fold the flag in half by the fly side;
- (viii) Fold the flag in half by the bottom;
- (ix) Fold the flag in half by the top.

(B) Storing the flag and coat of arms;

(a) National flags;

(i) Flags upon completion of use shall be stored in the following conditions;

- 1) Flag shall be rolled storage tube, or shall be stored flat,
- 2) Shall be kept in climate and light controlled environment,
- 3) Shall be kept in a airtight container,
- 4) Shall be wrapped with acid-free tissue paper or unbleached cotton cloth.

(C) Retiring the flag;

(a) When a flag becomes tattered and is no longer in a suitable condition for use, it should be destroyed in a dignified way.

(b) A flag is considered to be tattered or worn when the color has faded, it has developed a hole, or the outermost seam (fly) of the flag has become frayed. When a flag is no longer in a suitable condition for use, it should be disposed of in a dignified manner.

(c) Disposal of such flags may be handled in the following manner:

(d) Flags made of natural fibers (wool, cotton, linen) should be burned in a dignified manner; privately without ceremony or public attention being drawn to the destruction of the material;

(e) Flags made of synthetic material (nylon or polyester) should be respectfully torn into strips, with each element of the flag reduced to a single color, so that the remaining pieces do not resemble a flag.

The individual pieces should then be placed in a bag for disposal – the shreds of fabric should not be re-used or fashioned into anything

(D) Retiring the coat of arms;

(a) All arms, upon the damage or spoiling of its grandeur the arms shall be removed from public view and shall be divided into six pieces, the crowns, the pelican and the four quarters of the shield. Upon the

dismemberment of the arms, it shall be burnt, or in times where burning can not occur, it shall be disposed of by placing it into a bag for disposal and shall not be re-used or fashioned into anything.

(E) Memorial display;

(a) Memorial displays shall be at the discretion of the Sovereign Council of Ste. Croix for civilian events, and for military events shall be at the discretion of the National Constabulary.

(b) Color guard;

(i) Opening:

1) Have the color guard in the back of the room, ready holding the flags. The National Flag is on the right, then the Parish flag, the Village flag on the left as the color guard is facing towards the front of the room - or, National Flag in front, followed by the Parish flag, then the Village flag. Leader: "Color Guard, Attention!" Leader: "Audience, Please Rise!" Leader: "Salute! Those not in uniform, please place your right hand over your heart." Leader: "Color Guard, Forward March!" Wait for color guard to reach the front. Leader: "Color Guard, Halt!" Leader: "Color Guard, Cross the Colors!" Parish and Village flags stop. The National Flag crosses in front of other flags to the left-most flag stand (as viewed from the audience), then the Parish flag advances, then the Village flag. Wait for flag bearers to move to the flag pole stands. Leader: "Please recite the Oath to the Crown!" Leader: "TWO!" Everyone drops salute. Leader: "Color Guard, Post the Flag of the Auguric Republic! " Leader: "Color Guard, Post the Flag of the Honored Parish! " Leader:

"Color Guard, Post the Flag of the Village! " Leader:
"Color Guard, Honor your Colors!" Flag bearers salute
the national flag. Leader: "Color Guard, return to ranks!"
Wait for flag bearers return to formation. Leader:
"Audience, Please be seated!"

(ii) Closing:

- 1) Leader assembles a color guard in the back of the room or offstage so they are ready. You may only have flag bearers, 2 or 3 members following, 2 in front and 2 behind, or any crisp formation depending on number of scouts in color guard. Leader: "Color Guard, Attention! " Leader: "Audience, Please Rise! " Leader: "Color Guard, Forward March! " (wait for the color guard to reach the front) Leader: "Color Guard, Halt! " Leader: "Salute! Please put your right hand over your heart if you are not in uniform." Leader: "Color Guard, Retrieve the Colors! " (wait for flag bearers to pick up their flags) Leader: "Color Guard, Return to Ranks! " (Members not carrying flags turn around so they are facing the audience. Wait for flag bearers to return to formation) (NationalFlag is on the far right facing the audience, then the parish flag, then the village flag on far left.) Leader: "Color Guard, Forward March! " (wait until the color guard reaches the back of the room) Leader: "Color Guard, Halt! " Leader: "TWO! " (everyone drops salute.) Leader: "Audience, Thank you for joining us. " Leader: "Color Guard, Dismissed! " (flag bearers should immediately put the flags away before starting to play with the other guys.)

(c) Half-masting;

- (i) The flag shall be raised to the top of the mast as usual, however it shall then be lowered to half-mast and shall remain so until time to take down for the day.
- (ii) Half-masting shall be at the direction of the Prince of Isturus, and or the Sovereign Council of Ste. Croix.

SECTION VIII. MERCHANT DISPLAY AND USE

- (A) The National Flag is the proper national colors for all Auguric ships and boats, including pleasure craft.
- (B) On entering or leaving any foreign port; and on entering or leaving any Auguric port if carrying 50 tonnes gross tonnage or upwards.
- (C) Foreign vessels may fly the Auguric flag as a "courtesy flag" when they are docked in a Auguric port.
- (D) General rules governing merchant vessels and pleasure craft are as follows:
 - (a) The flag should be worn in harbor and in territorial waters. It does not need to be worn while under way on the high seas unless the vessel wishes to identify her nationality to another ship.
 - (b) Whenever possible, the proper place for a vessel to display the national colors is at the stern; however, the flag may be flown from a gaff when at sea.
 - (c) When in harbor, the flag should be hoisted at 0800 hours (8 a.m.) and lowered at sunset.
 - (d) When a merchant ship and a warship of any nationality pass or overtake one another, the merchant ship should dip the flag as a

gesture of courtesy. If on a staff, the lowest corner of the flag should be brought to the level of the rail and kept there until the salutation is acknowledged by the naval vessel. If flown from a gaff, the flag should be lowered to six feet (1.80 m) above the level of the deck, until the salute is acknowledged.

- (e) In times of mourning, the flag may be flown at half-mast, which places the upper corner of the flag next to the staff at approximately three-quarters of full-hoist. As on land, a flag hoisted to or lowered from half-mast position must first be pulled close-up.

SECTION IX. INFRINGEMENTS AND SANCTIONS

- (A) Whoever in any public place or in any other place within public view burns, mutilates, defaces, defiles, disfigures, destroys, temple upon or otherwise shown disrespect to or brings contempt to the Auguric Republic National Flag or any part thereof shall be punished by a trial of the People's Court of Hache.
- (B) Respect for the flag shall be defined as;
 - (a) Shall not be flown at half-mast except on which has been directed by the government.
 - (b) Shall not be used as drapery in any form whatsoever, exceptions include private funerals.
 - (c) Shall not be used as a costume or uniform, embroidered or printed upon furniture or dress material.
 - (d) Shall not have lettering placed upon it.
 - (e) Shall not be used as a receptacle for receiving, delivering, holding or carrying anything.

- (f) Shall not be used to cover a speaker's desk or platform.
- (g) Shall not be intentionally placed or laid onto the ground.
- (h) Shall not be draped over the hood, top or back of any vehicle.
- (i) Shall not be used as a covering for a building.
- (j) Shall be placed in a position of honor and distinctly placed.
- (k) Shall not be flown or displayed in any damage manner.
- (l) Shall not be flown at masthead with any other flag or flags.
- (m) When displayed on a speaker's platform, it shall be flown on the speaker's right, or flat against the wall, above and behind the speaker.
- (n) No other flag or bunting shall be placed higher or above or side by side with the national flag, unless within the Royal Residence.
- (o) Where the flag is displayed in the open, it shall be flown from sunrise to sunset, regardless of weather conditions, unless damage to the flag is possible.
- (p) When the flag is damaged or in a soiled condition, it shall be destroyed as a whole in private, by burning.
