## Main focuses from 2024/25 academic year

The group's focuses (see below) reflect our missions: to expand opportunities for more ALDinHE members to get involved in Learning Development (LD) scholarship; to increase the visibility of LD scholarship; to fund high-quality LD-centric research

- Developed training for LD-based researchers around project design and applying for funding. This followed from community feedback from an ALDCON24 mini-keynote by the chair and vice-chair about the need for such training to help researchers get started. Pilot to be delivered May 2025; 50 sign-ups at time of writing.
- New assessment criteria, scoring, applicant guidance, review form and descriptors launched for the 2024 funding round; training provided for reviewer pool. Positive feedback received from reviewers, while group were pleased that the process enabled research projects strongly in accordance with the ALDinHE values scoring highly and receiving the awards (see table below).
- 'Project partnership' put into place for funded projects each 2024 project lead has a designated RSDWG point of contact, and regular check-ins are maintained

- Group has completed the background work to launch two new resources in mid-2025:
  - Collective Library of LD Scholarship: short reviews by the ALDinHE community of seminal texts in various strands of LD scholarship, available to whole community via ALDinHE website
  - Legacy Funding project: updated record of progress of ALDinHE-funded projects since the scheme's inception, e.g. outputs, subsequent research
- Continued to offer scholarship writing retreats at regular intervals

## **Priorities for the coming academic year 2025/26:**

Extend the researcher training pilot from one session to sequence of three, and in the process broaden its appeal to less experienced researchers

Survey the ALDinHE community in 2025 about what more the RSDWG can offer to encourage/enable more people into LD scholarship. Act upon this feedback when determining events for 2026.

Agreement secured from ALDinHE for increased funding per project to account for inflation plus a small addition. Rise from £1000 to £1250 maximum per project from 2025 funding.

Reflect ALDinHE's strategic priority of student partnerships through the research strand – if this can be demonstrated by applicants, an extended funding amount of £1500 can be requested. Aim to fund at least one project demonstrating genuine student partnership in 2025

Launch 'Collective Library of LD Scholarship' and 'Legacy Project Funding' areas of website as ways to showcase historic LD scholarship and the outcomes of funding

Support ALDinHE 'summer fair' event in 2025 through offering reviewer training and scholarship writing retreats

More debriefing by the group on 2024-25 projects to keep their momentum alive / help them with channels to disseminate after completion of the funded period.
