- Bolded Courses:** Best practice, recommended courses that are intentionally aligned to standards and industry certifications.
- Pathways should consist of a four-course sequence that includes work-based learning opportunities, industry certifications and intra-curricular SkillsUSA experiences.
- Concentrator**— A student that has completed 2 courses in a single program of study (career pathway). In Kentucky a course is defined as 1 credit on the student's official transcript.
- Completer** - Secondary student who completes four or more credits in the pathway and also earns a high school diploma. The four credits must be within the same CIP code.
- Special Topics Course Option:** Utilization of this option [requires an approved pathway modification request](#) submitted through the Technical Education Database System (TEDS). The course is only approved for students who have completed 4 course credits prior to their enrollment or at the same time as their 4th course. The Deadline to submit for use in the current year is September 1st. The window opens for submission for the following school year on February 1st each year and again closes on September 1st. It is advised NOT to enroll students into a special topics course offering until after it has been approved as an addition to the pathway course options.
