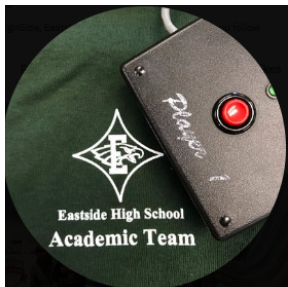

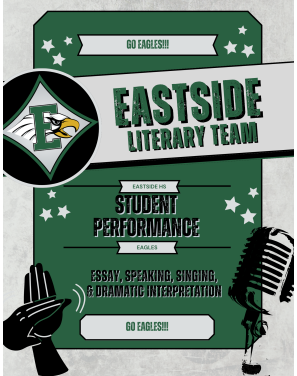
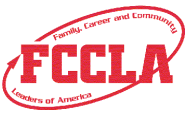
CLUB	SPONSOR	MEETING LOCATION	DESCRIPTION

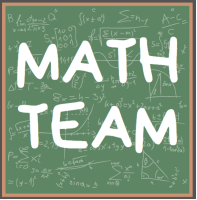
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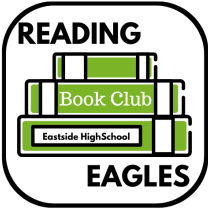

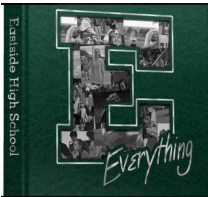
