POST #1: Electronics do not belong in the recycling bin

Electronics of any kind, do not belong in the recycling bin. Whether you are looking to dispose of your old laptop or cell phone, consider the mix of materials they are made of. Additionally, some electronics are battery-powered which adds another layer of complexity (and hazards) for recycling these items. Between the mix of materials and battery power, electronics have earned their right to an alternative recycling stream.

To recycle electronics right, visit the electronics recycling locator tool at RecycleRightNY.org/electronics-recycling-tool and find a drop-off location near you. Thank you for going the extra mile and doing your part to keep valuable resources in flow!

When we dispose of our old electronics we have to keep in mind that we are also often disposing of hazardous materials and valuable metals. Electronics are created using toxic metals such as lead, mercury and cadmium, and precious metals like copper, silver, and gold, meaning they require some special attention.

POST #3: Mining for coltan is driving gorillas to extinction

Today, many electronics, especially phones and laptops are created using a mineral called **coltan**. Due to its unique conductive properties, this mineral is relentlessly mined to keep up with the revolving door that is of new electronics. Coltan is predominantly found in the Democratic Republic of the Congo and neighboring countries in Central Africa. Unfortunately, a significant portion of coltan mining takes place in areas that overlap with the habitats of endangered gorillas.

By recycling electronics right, you can help reduce the demand for newly mined minerals and their impact on the environment and wildlife. Hold onto your old electronics until you find a recycling drop-off location near you by visiting RecycleRightNY.org/electronics-recycling-tool.

POST #4: Keep Vapes Out of Recycling Bins
