## **What Is Google Apps LTI Integration With Canvas?**

LTI stands for *Learning Tools Interoperability*. LTI provides a framework through which an LMS (**Canvas**) can send some verifiable information about a user to a third party, in this case **Google Drive**. You must authorize the **specific** Google Drive Account you want to access, whether you are creating assignments or students are submitting assignments. [Authorize "Services" In Canvas LMS 1.4](#) After creating a module, you will then create an assignment within that module, however if you are using a file from your Google Drive, you will need to select "external link" and then select the file. My journey continues to find more seamless and efficient ways to use G-Suite with Canvas,

## Activity 2: Creating An Assignment With Video And Using Student View

Creating an assignment brings up a "rich text" editor with several options. Images, YouTube, inserting links, links to Canvas Commons and much more. Several menu boxes are available for points, peer review required, not graded vs. graded, due dates, and rubrics, if you choose. I suggest starting simple and assigning some points and a broad range for turning in assignments.

### **Activity 3: Creating An Assignment Using An “External Tool” (Google Drive)**

Let's use some files from our Google Drive. First, make sure you have authorized access to the Google Account you desire to use. In the video I will demonstrate assigning collaborative Google Slides. Students will have “edit access” which will allow each student to add a slide to the presentation.

## Bonus Activity: Embed A Google Form As An Assignment

In my journey I have watched several videos on how to use G-Suite with Canvas. Embedding a Google Form seems to be the best way to use a form, in Canvas. You CANNOT use the “external link” feature on a Google Form. Once the Google Form is created, you will need the ***embed code*** and then use the html format tool. Use the Canvas ***Assignment*** feature, to paste the embed code. Let’s give this a try.

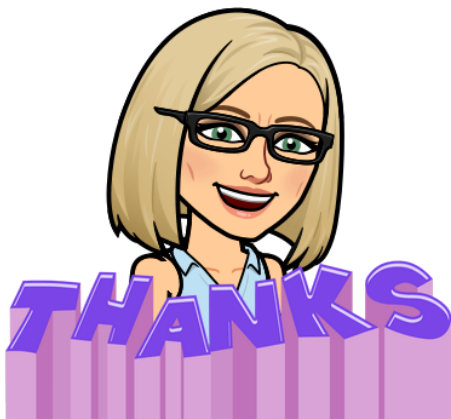
