

Privacy Policy for Loudify (Video Volume Booster)

Effective date: June 3, 2026 **App name:** Video Volume Booster: Loudify

1. The short version

Loudify processes your videos entirely on your phone. We do not upload, store, sell, or share your videos, your audio, or any personally identifiable information. We do not require an account. We do not run third-party advertising. If you stop using the app, there is nothing for us to delete because we never received anything in the first place.

The rest of this document explains the same thing in the language Google Play and the major privacy laws require.

2. Who we are

This app is published by the developer reachable at asadsajjad144@gmail.com For privacy questions, complaints, or data subject requests under the GDPR, UK GDPR, CCPA, or any other applicable law, write to that address. We aim to reply within 30 days.

3. What information the app handles

3.1 Information you provide directly

None. Loudify does not ask you to create an account, sign in, or enter any personal information.

3.2 Videos and audio you process

When you pick a video to boost, Loudify reads that file from your device's storage, processes the audio locally using the FFmpeg library bundled inside the app, and writes a new boosted file back to your storage. **The video and its audio never leave your device.** We do not have servers that receive your media, because the app has no networking code for media upload.

3.3 Permissions the app requests

Permission	Why we ask	What we do with it
Read media / video (READ_MEDIA_VIDEO on Android 13+, READ_EXTERNAL_STORAGE on older versions)	To let you pick the video you want to boost	Read only the file you select, only while you are using the app
Write to media store / save to gallery	To save the new boosted video so you can find it later	Write the output file to your gallery or chosen folder
Notification permission (Android 13+, optional)	To tell you when a long boost finishes	Only used for local processing notifications, no marketing pushes

We do not request location, contacts, microphone, camera, calendar, phone state, SMS, call logs, or any other sensitive permission.

3.4 Information collected automatically

None by us. We do not embed analytics SDKs, advertising SDKs, attribution SDKs, or crash reporting SDKs in this version of the app.

If a future version of the app adds an analytics or crash-reporting tool (for example Firebase Crashlytics) we will update this policy, change the effective date, and disclose what is collected and why before the change ships.

3.5 Information Google Play collects independently

Google Play itself collects information about installs, uninstalls, crashes, ratings, and aggregate usage as part of running the Play Store. That collection is governed by [Google's Privacy Policy](#), not this one. We can see aggregate, anonymized reports in Play Console but we cannot see which user did what.

4. How we use information

Because the app does not collect personal information, there is no "use" in the traditional sense. The video file you select is used only to perform the boost operation you asked for, and only on your device. No profile is built. No behavioral data is recorded.

5. How we share information

We do not share, sell, rent, trade, or transfer personal information to anyone, because we do not have it.

When you tap the share button inside the app, Android opens its standard share sheet so you can send the boosted video to another app you choose (WhatsApp, Instagram, email, etc.). Once the file leaves Loudify through that share sheet, it is governed by the privacy policy of whichever app you sent it to.

6. Data retention and deletion

The original video stays in your gallery, untouched, until you delete it. The boosted output file stays in your gallery, untouched, until you delete it. Loudify does not keep a copy of either file outside your device, so there is nothing on our side to retain or delete.

To delete a boosted video, delete the file from your gallery the same way you would delete any other video.

To uninstall the app, follow the standard Android uninstall flow. Uninstalling removes the app and any cached temporary files it created during processing.

7. Children's privacy

Loudify is not directed at children under 13 (or the equivalent minimum age in your country, for example 16 in parts of the EU). We do not knowingly collect personal information from children. If you believe a child has somehow provided personal information through the app, contact us at asadsajjad144@gmail.com and we will investigate, though as noted above the app has no mechanism to collect such information in the first place.

8. Your rights

Depending on where you live, you may have rights under laws such as the **EU GDPR, UK GDPR, California Consumer Privacy Act (CCPA/CPRA), Brazil's LGPD**, or similar legislation. These rights typically include the right to:

- access the personal data we hold about you
- correct inaccurate personal data
- delete personal data
- restrict or object to processing
- data portability
- withdraw consent
- lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority

Because we do not collect or store any personal data on our servers, most of these requests will be answered with confirmation that we hold nothing about you. To exercise any of these rights, write to asadsajjad144@gmail.com with the request and the country you reside in. We do not charge for handling these requests.

California residents: we do not "sell" or "share" personal information as those terms are defined under the CCPA/CPRA.

9. Security

Because nothing leaves your device, the main security surface is the device itself. We recommend keeping your phone updated, using a screen lock, and avoiding sideloading the app from sources other than the Google Play Store, where the app is signed and verified.

The app is built with Android's standard sandboxing, so it cannot read files outside the ones you explicitly grant access to through the system picker.

10. International transfers

We do not transfer your data internationally because we do not collect it.

11. Third-party services

This version of Loudify uses the following third-party components, none of which transmit your data off the device:

- **FFmpeg** (LGPL-licensed audio/video processing library, used purely on-device to perform the volume boost)

That is the full third-party list for the current release. If a future release adds a service that does transmit data, this section and Section 3.4 will be updated.

12. Changes to this policy

We may update this Privacy Policy from time to time, for example if we add a feature or change a service provider. When we do, we will update the **Effective date** and **Last updated** at the top of this document and post the new version inside the app and on the Play Store listing. If the change is material (for example, if we ever begin collecting personal data), we will surface a prominent in-app notice before the change takes effect.

You should review this policy occasionally to stay informed.

Notes for the developer (delete before publishing)

1. Fill in the effective date and last updated date at the top.
2. Host this document at a public URL (a static page on your own domain, a public GitHub Pages site, or a free service like termsfeed/iubenda) and paste that URL into Play

Console's "Privacy Policy" field. Play requires a publicly reachable URL, not an in-app-only document.

3. Mirror the same content inside the app under a "Privacy Policy" screen so users can read it without leaving Loudify.
4. The Play Console **Data Safety form** asks separately for the same information. Based on the current build, fill it in as: no data collected, no data shared, data is processed on-device only. If you add analytics or crash reporting later, both this document and the Data Safety form must be updated before the change rolls out.
5. If you publish in the EU, you may also want a tiny banner the first time the app opens that points to this policy, even though no consent is technically required when no personal data is collected.
