Course Description

Acquire knowledge, comprehension, and application of beginning to intermediate skills in choral singing. Students will develop musicianship and performance skills through rehearsals and performances. Choral repertoire chosen from the class will represent various historical periods, cultures, styles, genres, performance practices, and languages.

Student Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- Demonstrate beginning level vocal techniques
- Apply correct pitches as indicated with accurate intonation
- Execute appropriate articulation, dynamics, phrasing, and expression as directed
- Analyze, discuss, and present performance repertoire as directed
- Develop correct vocal diction in multiple languages
- Adapt professional level ensemble performance and rehearsal standards of conduct
- Evaluate and discuss the strength of personal and peer performances in rehearsal and performance settings

Course Content

Introduction

Acknowledge the origins, contributions, and confluences of African, Asian, European, and the Indigenous peoples of the Americas on the musical and related performance forms we practice today.

Course content includes musicianship development, rehearsal techniques, and final performance projects.

Course Requirements

- Attend every weekly rehearsal and arrive on time.
- Obtain advance approval for absences. A maximum of three excused absences from regular rehearsals is allowed each semester.
- For emergencies, notify the instructor and choir manager as soon as possible.
- Complete all course requirements to participate in performances and receive a final grade.

Required Materials

Music is selected by the conductor and distributed at the beginning of the semester. All scores are purchased by the Channel Islands Choral Association (CICA) and remain CICA property. Return all music at the end of the semester. Students are financially responsible for damaged or unreturned music. Mark borrowed scores in pencil only; do not use pen or highlighter.

CICA is a nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization that sponsors the CSU Channel Islands University Chorus, within which MUS 107 and 307 take place.

Attire for Live Performances

Option 1

- White button-up dress shirt; black tuxedo or black suit; black bow tie, socks, and shoes.

Option 2

- All-black attire: dress pants and/or skirt with top, or a long dress. Dresses and skirts must be at least three-quarter length.
- No spaghetti straps, bare shoulders, tube tops, low-cut tops, or excessive embellishment.
- Black closed-toe dress shoes and black stockings.
