<p>Study Programs Available</p>	<p>1. Japanese Language and Culture Program a. Semester program (Spring or/and Fall) b. Summer program (May–July) (minimal Japanese language background required) Those who take “Studies in Japanese Culture” class will be charged 15,000 JPY additionally for their excursions and materials.</p> <p>2. Undergraduate Study Program (must have the equivalent of Level N2 of the Japanese Language Proficiency Test)</p> <p>3. Graduate Study Program (must have the minimum Japanese and/or English proficiency required by the department of admission)</p>
<p>Accommodation and Meals</p>	<p>Accommodation is arranged in on-campus dormitories. Students are placed in single or double-occupancy rooms. Bed linens, blankets and pillows are provided. Wi-Fi is available in a dorm and hotspot on-campus.</p> <p>There is no dormitory meal plan, and so students must cook for themselves. Dormitories are equipped with full kitchen facilities.</p> <p>Estimate (subject to change) of dorm fees: 200,000 yen/semester, or 120,000 yen for the summer program.</p>
<p>Medical Insurance</p>	<p>All students who stay more than three months must enroll in the following (no waiver option):</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Japan National Health Insurance Program (approx. 2,000 yen/month, paid after arriving in Japan) 2. Emergency Insurance (approx. 5,000 yen/semester or 10,000 yen/year) 3. Accident Insurance (approx. 1,000 yen/year) * <p>All students who stay less than three months must enroll in the following (no waiver option):</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Emergency Insurance (approx. 24,000 yen/quarter) * 2. Accident Insurance (approx. 1,000 yen/year) * <p>Fees are included in the overall program fee. **All details of coverage are included with the acceptance packet.</p>
<p>Payment of Program Fees</p>	<p>Each student’s invoice for program fees will be sent to the home institution. If possible, we would like the university to make payment on behalf of the students, although students may make payment individually if they prefer. Payment should be made by bank transfer (details are included with the invoice), and all transaction fees for the bank transfer (domestic and international) must be paid by the remitter. The deadline for payment is indicated on the invoice.</p>
