Use your common sense and ask questions:

- Is this disinformation? Is it misinformation?
- Who is the source? Are they an expert?
- What is the bias? [All Sides Bias Chart](#)
- Is this an advertisement or paid content?
- Is this an opinion piece, editorial, or letter to the editor?
- Do other sources corroborate the information?

Written directions:

- Once you have found an article, you need to use NoodleTools to make a citation for it. There is a quick link on the library website or click [here](#).
- Log in to your account *via Google* (it won't work if you try to log in with a username and password)
- Create a project called "News Article"
- Click on the "Sources" tab
- Click "Create new citation"
- Choose "Website" (unless you used a paper copy of a newspaper or magazine, in which case you choose "Print or in-hand")
- Choose the type of source you used (Newspaper, radio program, etc.)
- Fill in the information and click "Save"
