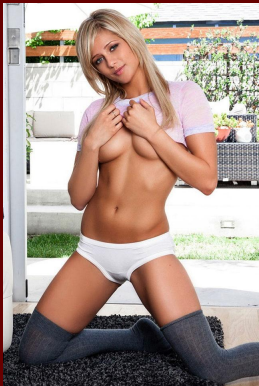

Featherweights



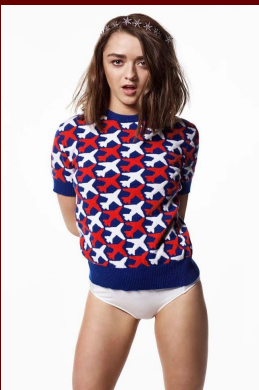
Audrey Alleen Allen 35-13 (Centerfold Angels) vs Miley Cyrus 32-11 (Badass Barbies)

Prior to UCC XXI, Audrey suffered three consecutive losses to the formidable blonde Barbie, Miley. However, Audrey's resilience and strategic adaptations proved fruitful as she triumphed over Miley in a closely contested split decision, claiming the UCC title. Darci Lynne Farmer 0-1 (The Wannabees) vs Kim Or Azulay 7-11 (Young Gunz)

The brash and aspiring Wannabees have become the hot topic in the UCC, and Darci is no exception. She radiates confidence, but as often witnessed in the UCC, backing it up can be a challenge. Darci started strong, and by the end of the first round, it seemed like Kim was in serious jeopardy. However, the Swami has discovered that the Young Gunz are as resilient as they come. Kim fought back and perhaps had some luck on her side, as she managed to close Darci's left eye and secured a fortunate victory.

Lightweights



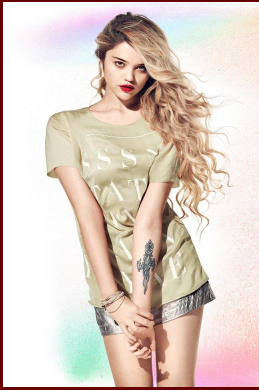
Elisabetta Gregoraci 29-12 (Karate Divas) vs Jennifer Connelley 28-11 (Hellfire Girls Club)

The fight was far from being a close contest, particularly after Katherine firmly grasped hold of Jayden. The new leader of the Wannabees will need to reassess her strategies, particularly if she aims to lead by example. Welterweights



Barbara Palvin 29-12 (Death by Bikini) vs Ellie Goulding 32-11 (Amped)

After an 11-fight winning streak and capturing the Welterweight title, Barbara has experienced a slump that many attribute to a case of the blues. Although she beat Ellie for the title at UCC XXI in Texas, Barbara subsequently suffered two defeats, with the most shocking being an upset loss to the now-departed unranked fighter, Willa Holland. This setback, combined with Ellie's determined pursuit of revenge, has left Barbara on the sidelines where she will be watching Megan Fox face Ellie for the championship.





Belen Rodriguez 22-13 (Queens of the Cage) vs Elisabetta Cannalis 18-9 (Kunoichi Combat Club)

Middleweights

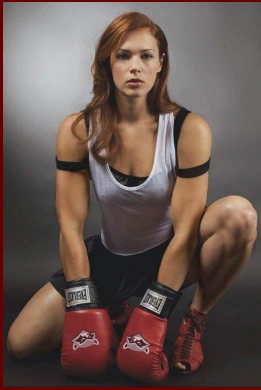
Lauralee Bell 1-2 (The Hot and the Dangerous) vs Madelyn Cline 0-1 (Badass Barbies)

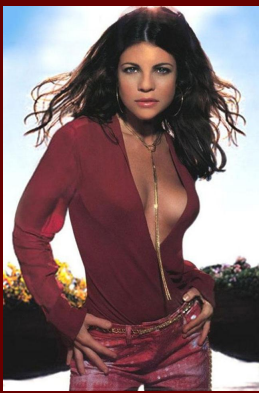
