Advisement to the EL Program ■ EL Team ■ ELPAC testing	 Mrs. Cole explains what the EL (English Learner) program entails at Palomar High School. we do not have bilingual classes, but we do have a team of 5 EL support teachers who work as a team. They are the ones that monitor the progress of our EL population. Mrs. Cole moves on to explain what the ELPAC is testing and what it aims to accomplish. Re-Classification: Reclassification is the process whereby a student is reclassified from English learner (EL) status to Fluent English Proficient (RFEP) status.
	 The students are tested on Reading & Writing, which they do via a computer. Their conversational skills are tested one-on-one

	 The ELPAC is a summative assessment that evaluates student learning at the end of an instructional unit by comparing it against some standard or benchmark. There are 4 levels of ELPAC scoring: 50% of that score comes from the Oral Language Portion (Listening & Speaking) and is measured from Level 1-4 			
	■ The other 50% is from the Written Language Portion (Reading & Writing) and is measured from Level 1-4			
	■ The ELPAC score levels of 1-4 cover a range of points from 1150 to 1800.			
	■ ELPAC testing will start on February 14th, 2024 and finish May 31st, 2024. This is the allotted time frame to test our EL students.			
	Ms. Cole announces that we reclassified 2 students last year, Rodrigo Hidalgo and Edson Gomez Luevano.			
5. Evaluation of SPSA Budget Allocation	 Ms. Cole gives the update for Section 1.3.9, the technology section for Title I, that Nurse Julie left behind an iPad that can be refurbished and used for SmartPass monitoring. It has not yet been used since the campus assistants are currently substitutes and are not in the system. She is thinking of letting them use her login for now but worries that the iPad has no protective case. Moving on to Section 1.3.10, Ms. Cole says there are pending licenses that the district has not yet paid. The accounting department is currently having difficulties with paying the vendors. The vendors are allowing teachers to use their products while waiting to get paid, but Ms. Cole is afraid that those products will not be available next year due to nonpayment. Ms. Cole says there is plenty of money for Section 3.2.4 parent training, and she is discussing with ASB advisors about having a job fair for students and parents. Ms. Garrett has stated that having the fair in the afternoon will allow students and their parents to come, as well as employers and recruiters.
