 we would need 1 or 2 volunteers to lead the moms in an activity and devotional and
 another 2 or 3 volunteers to supervise children while the moms are at their activity. This
 More than Moms event has typically occurred during a week night evening (5:30 -7:30
 pm) but it could also happen on a Saturday afternoon or lunch time or even in the
 morning if it works for the mothers and volunteers.
