Women in Baseball Network

The purpose of this group is to allow for networking and idea sharing between women who are involved or would like to become more involved with baseball in our Province. Baseball NL recognizes the fact that there are more barriers to women and gender diverse people in accessing this information and are hoping to bridge this gap by providing an inclusive learning environment. The group will discuss and explore a wide range of topics and presentations including administration, scorekeeping, rules, coaching, umpiring, etc. This group is open to women and people who identify as gender diverse.

Survey

Developed an annual survey to foster engagement, participation and ideas. The first survey was sent out in October 2020. A survey will be circulated to associations post agm in 2024.

Rules

Continued to review rules and rule modifications to ensure BNL is aligned with Baseball Canada and Baseball Atlantic while trying to ensure we do what is best for our athletes and province.

Sponsorship and Funding

Grassroots

Continued to work to grow the game at the grassroots level.

- Grow 12U age group across the province
- Social Media promotion and advertising
- Female Divisions for school tournaments
- Female Divisions in invitational tournaments
- Encourage / Add Female Champion in each association
- Encourage / Add more female coaches
- Encourage / Add more female officials
- Planning (Executive, Champions, Coaches, etc.)

Centers and associations need to ensure some level of short and long-term planning for their female programs as numbers are not as consistent as traditional male numbers and many female champions follow their own kids through the various stages and age groups.

High Performance

Continued to develop and enhance the NL Girls High Performance Program, which included incorporating female Teams in the new overall BNL High Performance Program which was launched in October 2021.

The 14U program hosted a provincial training camp in Pasadena.

The 16U program hosted a provincial training camp in Grand Falls Windsor.

- Team NL Burgundy won the Bronze Medal at the 14U Atlantic Championship
- Team NL Canada Games Training Pool won the 16U Atlantic Cup
- Women in Baseball NL Network
- Female Provincial Tournaments in 12U, 14U, 16U
- High Performance Fall/Winter Indoor training in Western and Eastern regions

Some other highlights that stood out personally for me as Female Baseball Co-Chair included:

- Honda Hickman Classic in Grand Falls Windsor
- BNL Developmental Teams Invitational tournament
- 21U Provincial team participating in the Mary Tavenor Tournament
- 21U Provincial team participating in the One Year Out Canada Games event
- 14U All Female Coaches at the 14U Atlantics

There were some challenges noted within the 12U division with manipulation of the rules and the competitive nature of several associations.

We are experiencing an issue with girls graduating 16U and not having a place to play locally and provincially.

Some other opportunities for review and continuous improvement include:

- Continuous rule review (Provincially, Atlantic and National)
- Tournament Formats, Rankings, Placements
- Tournament dates and scheduling
- Grassroots development in existing and new regions

- **BNL:** Maintain “Female Committee” Structure
- **BNL:** Work to identify a “Female Champion” in each association.
- **BNL:** Work to identify additional sponsorship opportunities for Female Baseball
- **BNL:** Provide funding opportunities for Female Baseball Athletes/Coaches/Managers
 - Hosting grant for Invitational, Provincial, Atlantic, and National Tournaments
 - Grant and scholarship opportunities for Female players
 - Funding for coaches/managers development
- **BNL:** Continue to host pre-provincial rule sessions.
- **BNL:** Female + Minor Committee: continue the ranking system
- **Female Committee:** Continue to support the Women in Baseball Network
- **Female Committee:** Plan to meet more regularly throughout the year
- **Female Committee:** In Conjunction with the High Performance Committee focus on opportunities for the older athletes (17+) in the province
- **General:** Associations should ensure coaches are prepared and aware of applicable division rules when participating in tournaments.
- **General:** Associations should try to follow BNL provincial rules when hosting invitational tournaments (where possible)
