#### **Document 1: WWII American Indian Recruiting Plan by Philip Johnson**

**Source Information:** This was a proposed plan for recruiting American Indians to join a code talkers corps for the United States in WWII. It was written by Philip Johnson in February 1942 in Los Angeles, California. Although Johnson was not a Navajo, he grew up on a Navajo reservation and was the son of a missionary. He became familiar with the people and their language and had the idea to use the Navajo language to send and receive messages in WWII.

#### Source

"Because of the fact that a complete understanding of words and terms comprising the various Indian languages could be had only by those whose ears had been highly trained in them, these dialects would be ideally suited to communication in various branches of our **armed forces (military)**. Messages sent and received between two individuals of the same tribe could not, under any circumstances, be interpreted by the enemy; conversations by telephone or by short-wave radio could be carried on without possibility of disclosure to hostile forces."
