

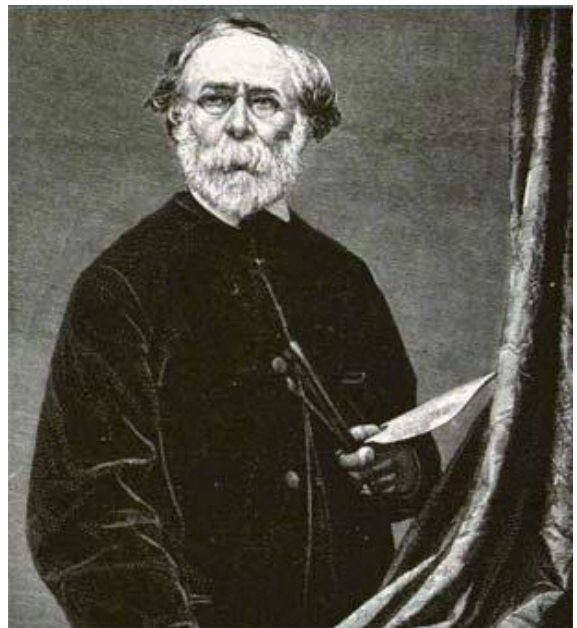

Paul Huet remains known for his romantic landscapes, tormented works with a broad touch, contrasting colors and threatening subjects. He is the pupil of Pierre–Narcisse Guérin and Antoine–Jean Gros (1771–1835). In Guérin's workshop, he meets Eugène Delacroix, whom he becomes his friend.

In 1822 , he lived in Paris with Richard Parkes Bonington (1802–1828), his classmate in the studio of Baron Gros.

Paul Huet begins at the Salon in 1827 . In the 1830s , he married his niece, Céleste Richomme. From 1838, he stayed several times in the South and Nice , whose climate was favorable to his wife. He then undertakes to return the local light to watercolor .



He receives the insignia of knight of the Legion of Honor on June 22, 1841.

In 1842 he stayed in Italy . In 1845 , he went to Eaux–Bonnes , in the Pyrénées–Atlantiques , with his friend Delacroix.
