**Consequences** If you are not fulfilling the above expectations in the classroom, I will have a conversation with you. You may need to answer a series of questions that will allow you to process what is occurring in the classroom, while documenting the incident. This may possibly be followed by a phone call home or a referral to administration.

Class time, time is CRUCIAL You are expected to be on time and ready to learn when the bell rings. You may only come late to class twice throughout the entire quarter. The **third** time you come late to class you will earn a detention. After two detentions, you will be referred to the administration. Coming late to class will be recorded on the closet door.

**Leaving the classroom** Being in class is important. Use the bathroom and water fountain during passing periods. You will be allowed to leave the classroom 6 times a trimester. Ask for permission with your hall pass then sign out on the form posted in the Google Classroom Forum. After 6 times you are not allowed to leave without earning a detention.

**Grades Grades are based summative assessments.** Classwork is a daily assignment and will not affect your final grade. Summative grades will measure your understanding of the classwork as it relates to the science standards. These grades will be assessed using points and rubrics and will count as your overall class grade for the trimester.

**Excused Grades** Occasionally, you may earn an excused grade. An excused grade will not help or hurt your grade.

Classwork Homework Grades - Executive Skills You cannot call home for homework. Plan ahead--double check. If you do not have your daily assignment the period it is due you will have earned a "late" assignment and it is recorded as a red box on PowerSchool. Homework is graded as an executive skill grade and if you do not have it done or with you, you have not shown skill of being prepared for class.

Missing Summative Grade Will count as a zero and will heavily affect your grade.

**Revisions** Revisions are only considered on <u>summative</u> work. They must be completed <u>within a week of the due</u> date and follow the revision guidelines which often will include additional practice of content. Quizzes may not be revised, only projects.

**Sick/Missing Class** You will be expected to make up work and complete curriculum you have missed. **It is YOUR responsibility** to find out missing work and make arrangements to complete it. My web page provides all the necessary information for anyone not in class. If needed, you should discuss and arrange a time with me to complete the work. A very good time to do this is during early bird or SSP. You will have as many days as they miss to make up for absent work.

**Assignment Notebook** You will need to use an assignment notebook to keep track of assignments, quizzes, tests, and projects. At the start of each week you can fill out your planner according to the classroom calendar during weekend check. Every day your homework should be recorded.

Chromebooks and Cell Phones Chromebooks may <u>only</u> be utilized for educational purposes. School rules state that cell phones must stay in your locker. If you are caught using a cell phone or chromebook in class inappropriately; it will be confiscated until the end of the day. If it happens a second time, the device will be given to the administration, and administration will contact home. **Keep cellphones in lockers!** 

**Pencils/Pens** Pencils are the preferred writing utensil. If you use a pen, only dark blue or black can be used. Do not use colored pens, colored pencils, or markers for homework. If you forget a pencil or pen you may borrow one from my front bin.

**Lost and Found** The side counter is the place where all lost belongings are kept. It is the first place you should look if you feel you left something in the room. I keep the expensive things---purses, calculators, glasses. Be sure that all of your belongings are marked clearly with your name.

These are the supplies you are expected to bring EACH day to class. You will receive executive functioning skill grades for being "ready" for class with your supplies.
