

«With Lo-Res Books, I am interpreting my own library, reducing the books in my memory and on my shelves to their smallest digital selves. In this pixelated form, they become abstract, mere suggestions of books. Blown up to poster size, these icons are transformed into flags or beacons. While seemingly abstract, they act as a kind of semaphore, signaling a shared cultural connection between anyone who can decipher them.»

«If digital covers as we know them are so 'dead,' why do we hold them so gingerly? Treat them like print covers? We can't hurt them. They're dead. So

let's start hacking. Pull them apart, cut them into bits and see what we come up with.» - <u>Hack The Cover</u>, Craig Mod (2010)







«JPEG image compression is lossy. Every time you edit and save a picture, some of the original content is lost. But it's difficult to see that with the naked eye, so I compressed Shakespeare instead. That's the balcony scene from Romeo and Juliet, compressed at "maximum" quality in Photoshop: I loaded the text as a RAW, then outputted the compressed file back to plain text.»

56 Broken Kindle Screens is a print on demand paperback that consists of found photos depicting broken Kindle screens. The Kindle is Amazon's e-reading device which is by default connected to the company's book store.

The book takes as its starting point the peculiar aesthetic of broken E Ink displays and serves as an examination into the reading device's materiality. As the screens break, they become collages composed of different pages, cover illustrations and interface elements.







Distraction


«One of the most ignominious trends in writing is multimedia books: "transmedia", apps, "augmented" or "enhanced" ebooks, a category error by publishers desperate to embrace technology and making the mistake that other forms of media — video, audio, nebulous "interactivity" — are somehow improvements on the text. In fact, the reverse is true. Books are a medium of the imagination, a true interactivity where the reader animates the writers' intentions in their own mind. The distraction of multimedia reduce the bandwidth of the imagination.» James Bridle
