A special note of periodization and the terms¹:

Time Period Two covers c. 1648 to c. 1815 and contains many overlaps with Time Period One and Three. Much of the groundwork for the absolute monarchs started during Time Period One. The development of the Industrial Revolution does not fit nicely into the political divisions of the time periods, but it is a significant topic to understand as you go through European History. Time Period Two concludes with the Congress of Vienna redistributing Europe after the collapse of the Napoleonic Empire.
