

3-D FOUNDATIONS

Course Description:

3-D Foundations is a semester-long course. The focus of this course will be the introduction to, and study of, three-dimensional art forms. Students will learn to work with paper, cardboard, plastic, wood, clay and other materials to make interesting and engaging three dimensional forms. 3-D Foundations is designed to strengthen one's ideas, techniques, and vocabulary in all types of three-dimensional art forms, in a fun and supportive setting.

As evidenced based on classroom assessments, the student is able to:

- A.A.R.18.h Interpret: Explain the intent, meanings, and impacts of different media works of art and design, considering complex factors of context and perspective.
