Monday, May 9, 2022 Minutes

Jenny introduced the board members and thanked the interpreters: Julio for Spanish, and Rahel for Amharic.

- Teacher & Staff appreciation week and luncheon: Thank you to the Committee Chair, Margaret McGilvray, and her wonderful committee for this event and all the other activities this year. Also a shoutout to the Spanish parents who attended and helped out. Teachers and staff were very appreciative.
- o <u>Plant Sale April 30</u> (Stephen Duall, Chair); The plant sale is our main fundraiser every year. It raised funds for teacher grants. We raised over \$8,000 this year! We received great community support and generosity. Thanked Dr. Willmore, the PTSA, Judith, Jenny, Beth, the custodial staff that worked on Saturday and all the student volunteers from garden club and cohort that helped from 6am to the end. Thanked Wendy Maitland, Lisa LaBella for their leadership. Special shoutout to Walter Wismeyer who raised and donated 100s of vegetable seedlings to sell during the event. All proceeds went to the PTSA. Thanked Ron Rosenberg, Rosemary O'Neill who handled online preorder process. Big thank you to the plant sale committee and volunteers. Stephen will be leading the plant sale again next year and welcomes new volunteers.
- o <u>Teacher grants</u> (Jenny Sammis) We gave out grants in November 2021 and March 2022 this year. With our \$5K budget for this year we funded new equipment for geometry, ceramics, speakers, field trips for students who've never taken metro to National Mall, college tours, a Wakefield cookbook and more. We received wonderful thank you notes from the students as well as photos. Johnny Stewart's ESL students put together a cookbook of stories and recipes from their culture which will be available to purchase from Boosters soon.

V. Dr Willmore

- 1. Thanked the PTSA for providing the staff lunch; very appreciated by staff.
- 2. About 45 high schools from around the state had students walk out today for a student organized event. We had maybe 250-300 students participate. They went to stadium during the last period and came back in before the end of the day. They were well behaved.
 - -If your student participated, the parent should email the attendance office to excuse your student.
- 3. May 30, no school.
- 4. SOL schedules coming out: On Tues, May 31 will do bulk of SOL testing. Some 11th graders will do the reading test the week before. Morning: first three hours set aside for testing: 8:19 11:00am. Non testing students go to the auditorium for asynch work. We have test prep rooms available to help students prepare. There will be two periods of classes during the end of the day. Students will be notified by counselors what they need to take. They will send a list of SOL tests to all students so they know what they are taking. All SOLs used to be required, but now you only take the ones you need for graduation. 9th graders will need to take Math and Biology. They will also need World History if they didn't pass the World Geography SOL. Check with your student's counselor to be sure if your child needs to take the SOL.
- 5. Final exam schedule will circulate soon. :

Friday, June 10: is normal 1 day but bell schedule will be different

Monday, June 13: begin and end each day with a two-hour final exam block

Tuesday, June 14 is a full day of school with 2 exams

Wednesday, June 15 is an early release day: dismissal 12:30pm

Some teachers do not give a traditional final exam but will have a project or presentation. Every class will have some sort of final activity. If a student has an A average, they can be excused from the final activity. This year, the final exam will count towards students' grades: it can decrease or increase their final grade. Most of the class syllabilist if there will be a final exam.

6. Senior Class Activities

June 10 – Senior picnic, last day of school

June 16 – Graduation; there will be a 9:00am for rehearsal where students will receive their cap and gown and 5 tickets. They go home after rehearsal. Return to Wakefield at 5:30pm to be bused to Constitution Hall. Graduation starts at 7:30pm. Must have a ticket to attend. Doors open 1 hour early, first come first serve seating. No cell phones allowed for graduating students; they will be taken! It's a large place so plan a meeting spot where to meet your student afterwards. There is a limit on the number of tickets each student receives because of space limitations at Constitution. No parking at the hall. There are nearby garages. No street parking. No live stream this year; it is too expensive .
