



CEU Red Cross Youth Holds Annual General Assembly



The CEU Red Cross Youth convened its annual General Assembly on September 5, 2025, at the ISC Mezzanine of Centro Escolar University Manila. The event, themed "Red Alert: Get Ready to Serve and Take Action," officially launched the organization's activities for the 2025-2026 Academic Year.

Mr. Angelito Francisco, Chapter Service Representative of the Philippine Red Cross - Manila Chapter, served as the primary speaker. He delivered the Youth Volunteer Orientation Course, outlining the fundamental principles of the Red Cross movement and the essential responsibilities of student volunteers in both campus and community settings.

The assembly served multiple operational purposes. The organization introduced its faculty adviser and executive officers for the academic year. Members reviewed and ratified the constitutional framework and governing bylaws. Leadership presented the detailed action plan outlining projected activities and initiatives. The program incorporated team-building exercises designed to strengthen collaboration between new and returning volunteers.

This initiative aligns with several United Nations Sustainable Development Goals, particularly SDG 4: Quality Education through leadership development, SDG 11: Sustainable Cities and Communities through community service preparation, and SDG 17: Partnerships for the Goals through institutional collaboration with the Philippine Red Cross.

The CEU Red Cross Youth maintains its position as one of the university's most active service organizations. The group regularly coordinates blood donation drives, disaster preparedness training, and various humanitarian projects throughout the academic year.

The well-attended assembly established the foundation for the organization's yearly operations, beginning with a blood donation drive scheduled for September. Leadership confirmed plans for continued volunteer training and community service initiatives, reinforcing the organization's commitment to developing student leaders while addressing identified needs within the broader community.
